

- UNODC has been supporting Member States with ICCS implementation since 2015
  - Capacity building through national level and regional workshops
- ICCS Implementation Manual developed
  - To be released later this year
  - Practical guidance on how to implement ICCS
  - To include several concrete case studies from Member States

- Chapter 1 explains rationale for development and main structure
- Chapter 2 introduces ICCS implementation road map
  - Phase 1: Build the case for implementation
  - Phase 2: Assess and plan
  - Phase 3: Map criminal offences (correspondence table)
  - Phase 4: Gradual implementation
  - Phase 5: Produce statistical outputs
- Road map includes practical tools and advice (e.g., assessment protocol for criminal justice statistics system)

- Chapter 4 introduces correspondence tables
  - Manual to be accompanied by correspondence table template
  - Describes step-by-step process
- Chapter 5 discussed the ICCS disaggregating variables
- Chapter 6 gives brief overview of data production
