

Update on the Publication of the Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose 2018 (COICOP 2018)

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COICOP in general

- Objective: To provide an international reference framework for grouping <u>household consumption</u> <u>expenditures</u> on goods and services within homogeneous categories. The categories are based on the <u>particular purpose</u> that those goods and services are considered to fulfil
- Part of the International Family of Classifications (IFC) and one of the Classifications of Expenditure According to Purpose, along with Classification of the Functions of Government (COFOG, currently under revision*), Classification of the Purposes of Non-Profit Institutions Serving Households (COPNI) and Classification of the Outlays of Producers According to Purpose (COPP)
- Integral part of the System of National Accounts (SNA), also used in other statistical areas: household budget surveys and analyses of living standards, consumer price indices, etc.

* COFOG revision proess will assess impact of revised COFOG on other classifications of expenditure according to purpose and make recommendation on whether they require revision as well





Background of the revision process

In March 2018, at its forty-ninth session, the <u>Statistical Commission</u> endorsed the revised Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 2018) and recommended that countries use the classification as a statistical standard

Revised COICOP was published on the UNSD website as a 'white-cover' version

- This document subsequently underwent an official editing process led by Eurostat, UNSD and a consultant (Mr. Norbert Rainer), resulting in the updated, pre-copy-edited publication
- > Final version of COICOP 2018 publication will be provided when available

Major changes in COICOP 2018 compared to COICOP 1999 1/4

Introduction of a subclass at 4th level (five digits)

- Most countries were collecting data at more detailed level & were in favor during consultation
- ECOICOP and other regional classifications already using 5th digit
- Easier correspondence with CPC Ver 2.1 & facilitates separation of goods & services

Major changes in COICOP 2018 compared to COICOP 1999 2/4

- Improved correspondence between COICOP and other classifications.
 - COICOP 2018 and CPC Ver. 2.1
 - Division 06 'Health' and the International Classification for Health Accounts (ICHA)
 - Division 10 'Education Services' and the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED 2011)
- Extended revision of COICOP 1999 divisons 08 'Communication', 09 'Recreation, Sport and Culture' and 10 'Education Services'
- Split of COICOP 1999 division 12 'Miscellaneous goods and services' into COICOP 2018 division 12 'Insurance and financial services and division 13 'Personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services'

Major changes in COICOP 2018 compared to COICOP 1999 4/4

 COICOP 2018 distinguishes between goods and services wherever possible; and new classes and subclasses for services such as repair, maintenance, installation and rental of products have been created systematically



However, in specific contexts expenditures on services and expenditures on goods cannot be separately identified (cf. division 11 'Restaurants and accommodation services')

• For analytical purposes, the distinction among products on the basis of whether they are durable (D), semi-durable (SD) or non-durable goods (ND) or services (S) is retained
