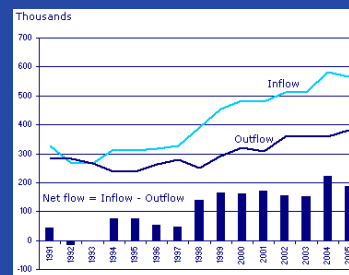
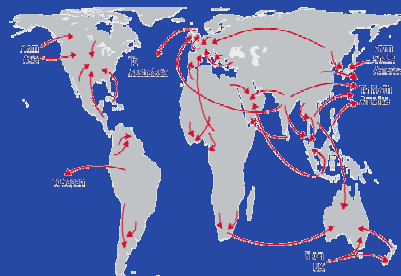

# Concept and information needed

## **Migrant stock**

Total number of international migrants in a given country at a particular point in time  
= lifetime migrants

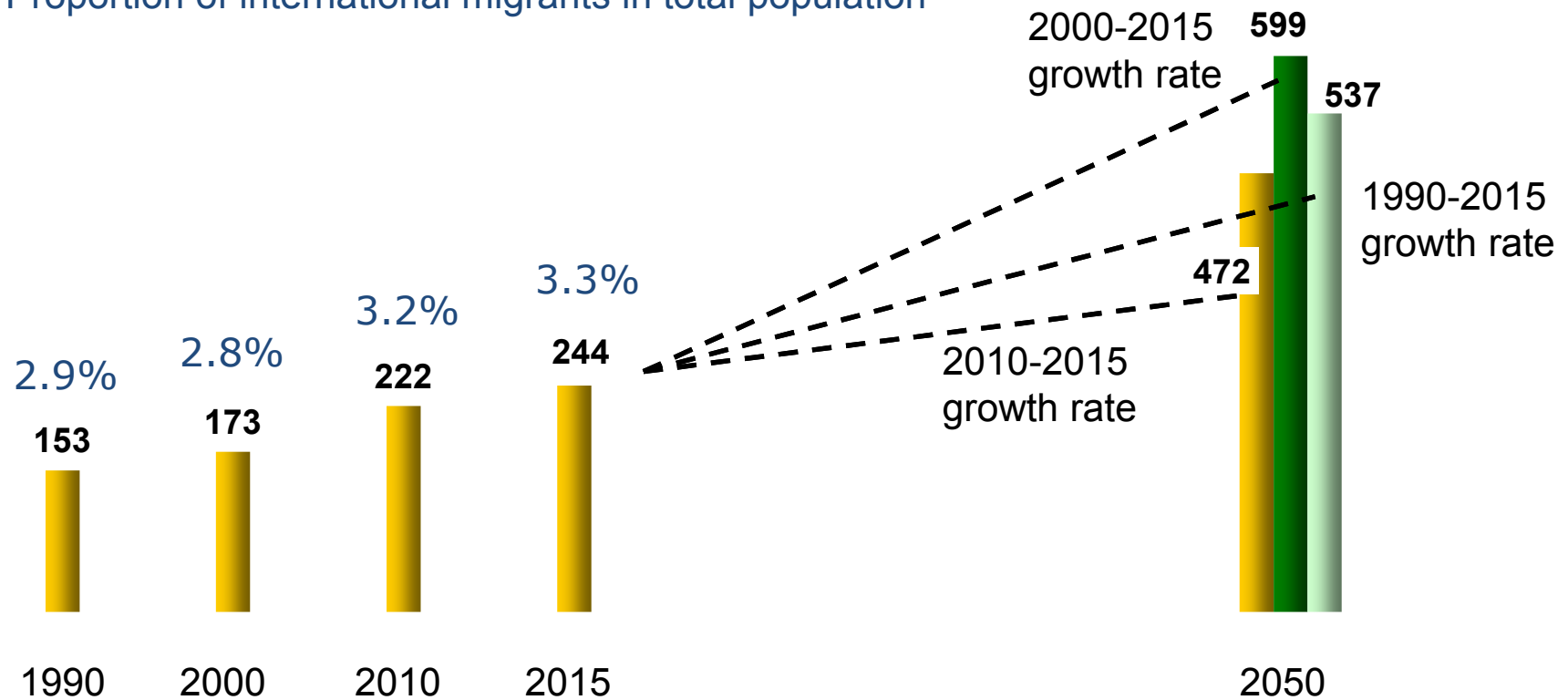
## **Information needed from censuses**

- ✓ Country of birth/Nationality  
(supplemented by refugee population)
- ✓ Age
- ✓ Sex

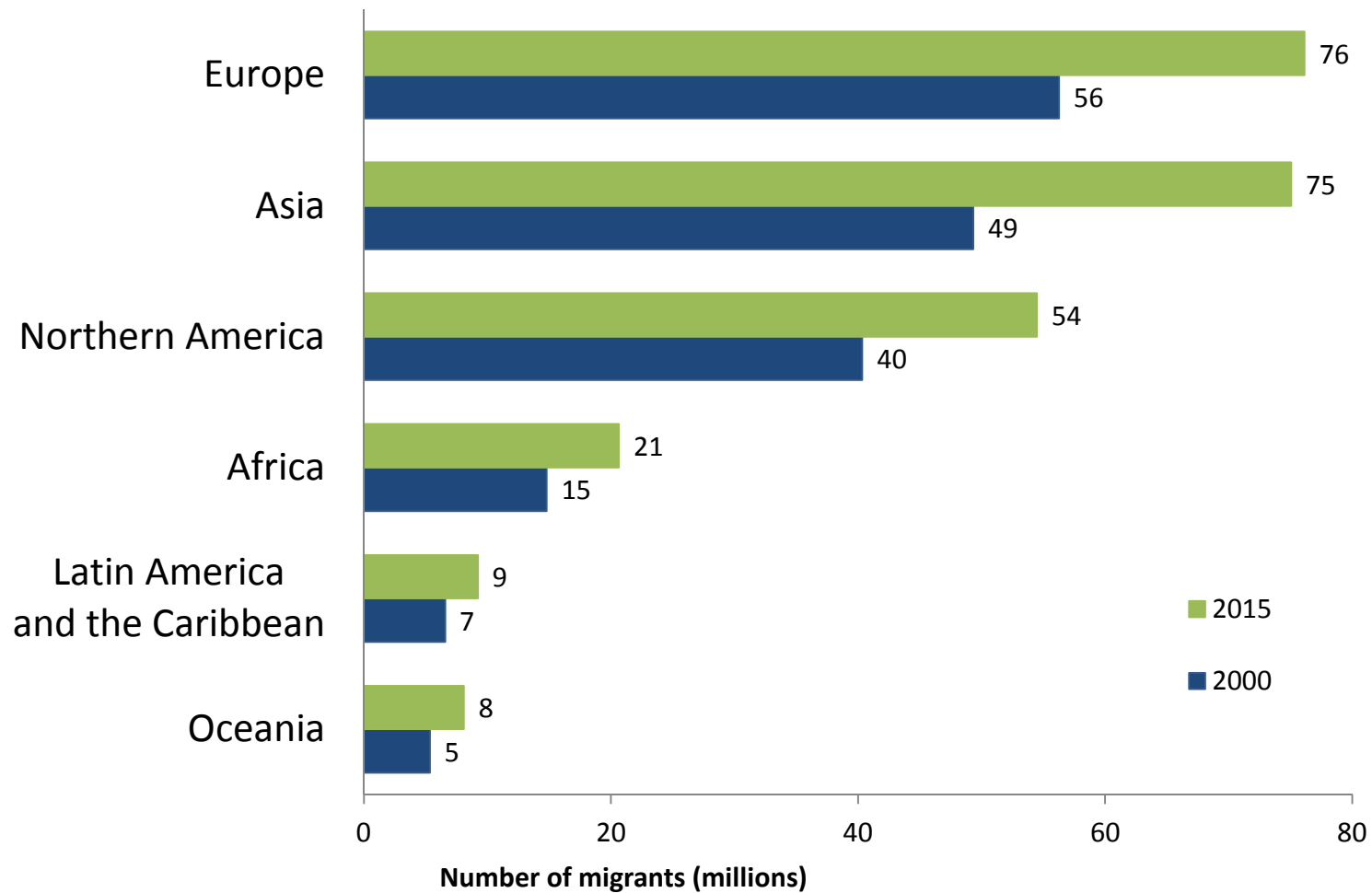
# Global Migrant Stock on the Rise

Proportion of international migrants in total population

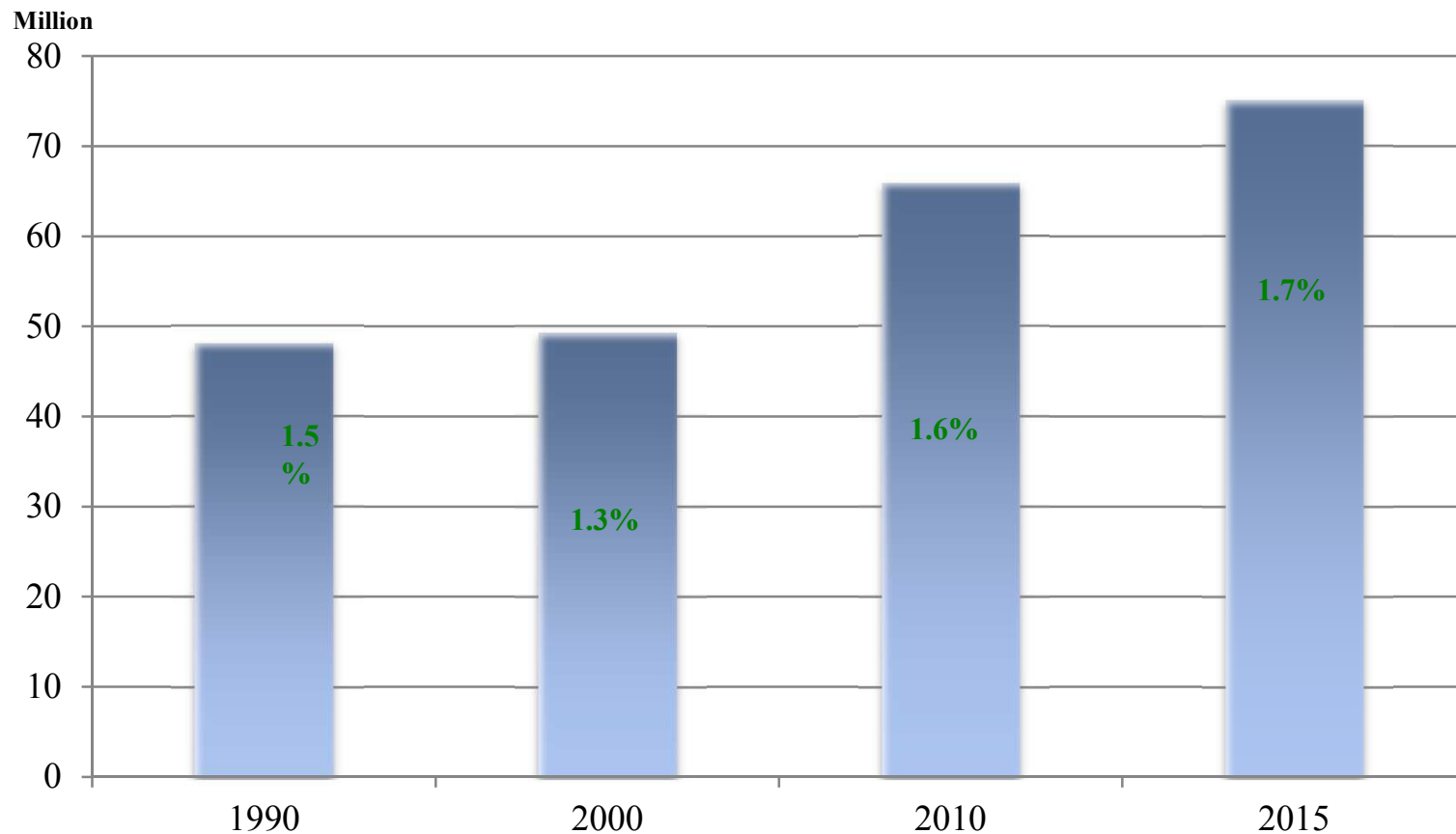


# Distribution of international migrants by major region, 2000 and 2015

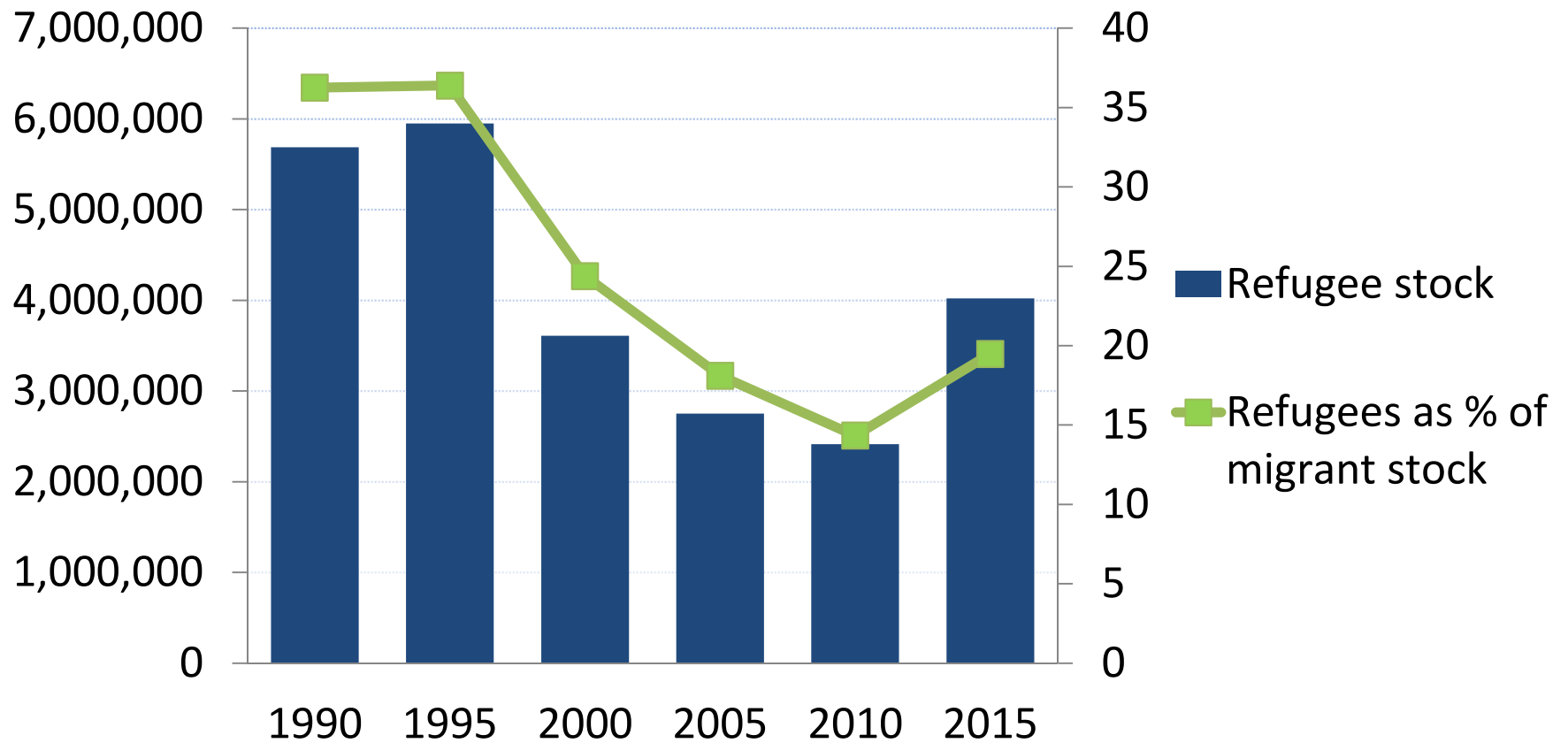


# International Migrant Stock in Asia (1990-2015)

Proportion of international migrants in total population (%)

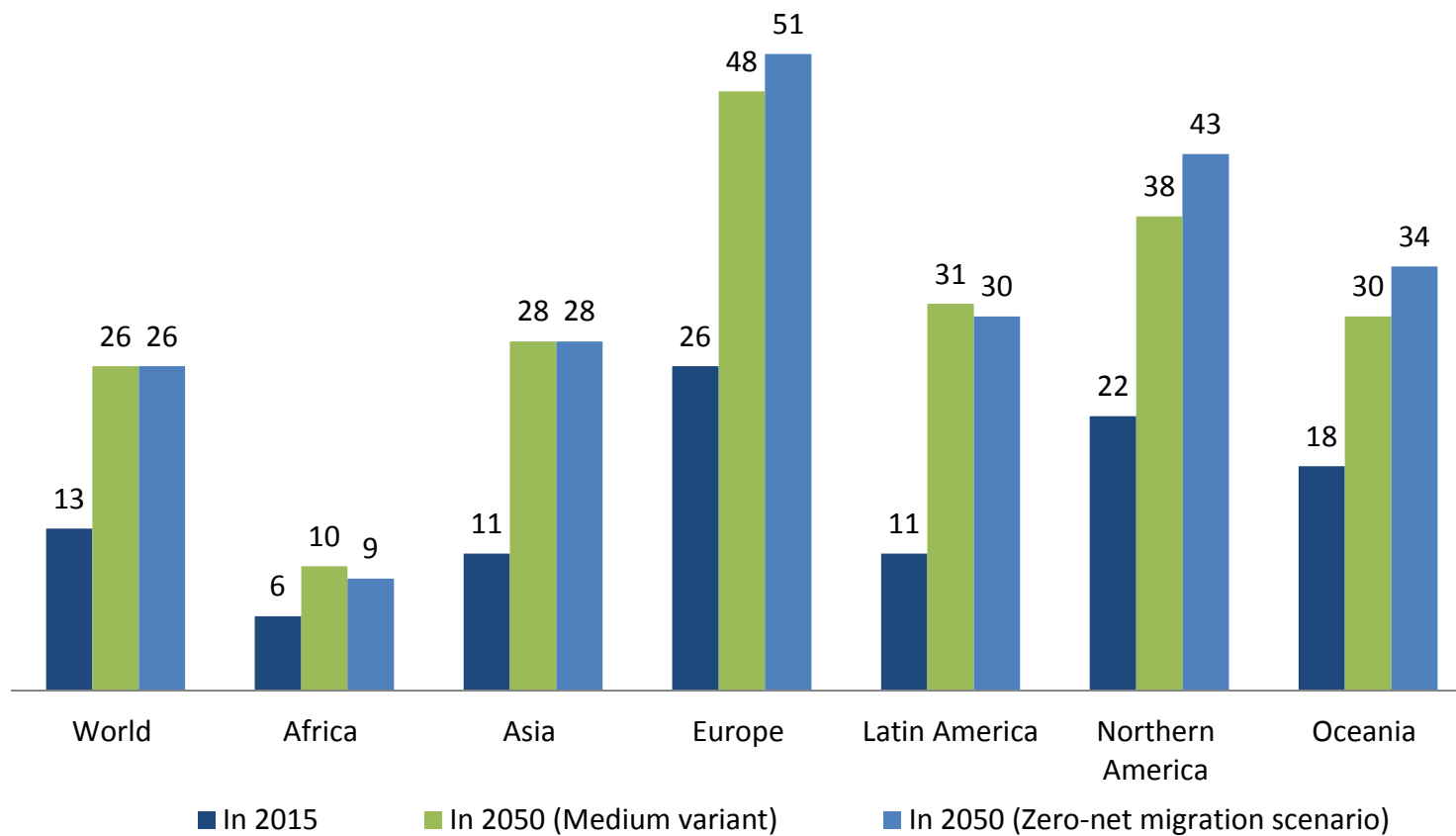


# Refugee Stock in Africa



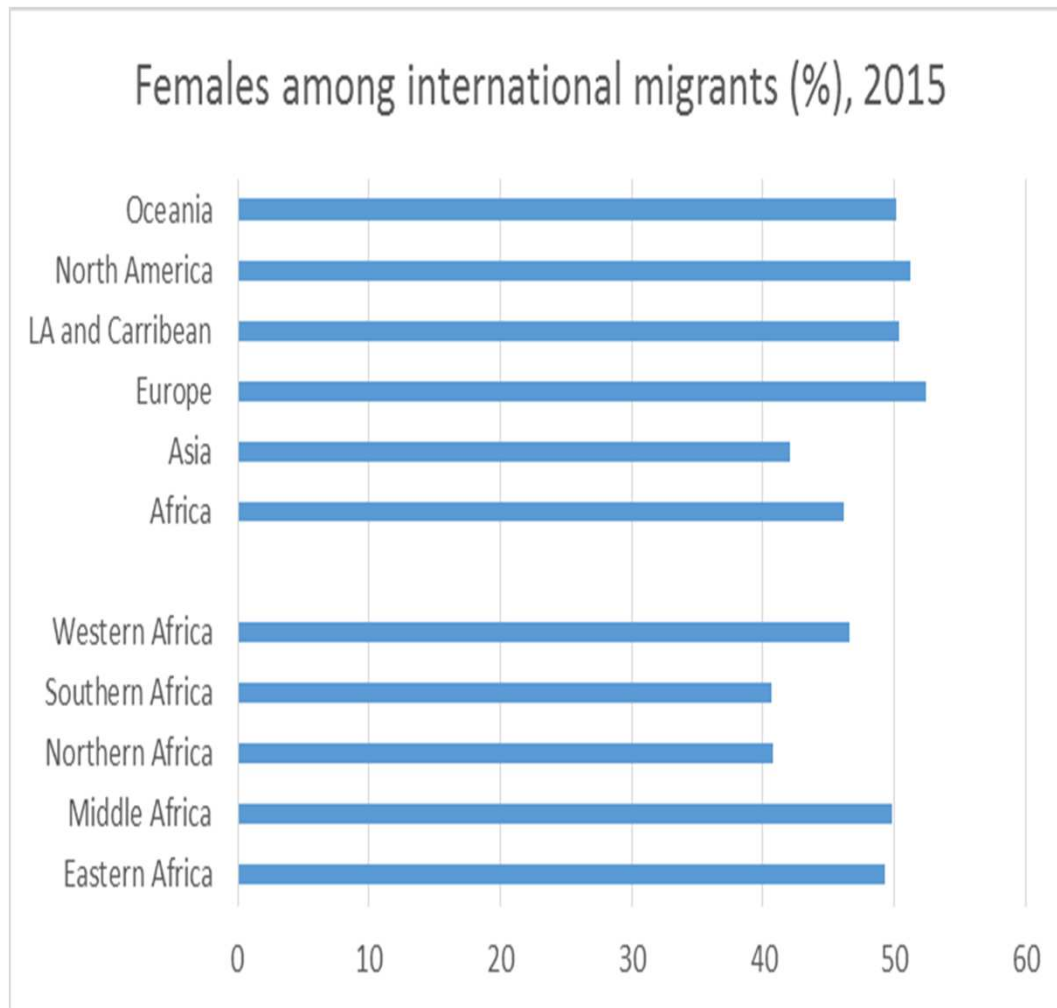
# Old-age Dependency Ratios, 2015 and 2050 the medium variant and the zero-net migration scenario

Migration cannot reverse the trend of population ageing





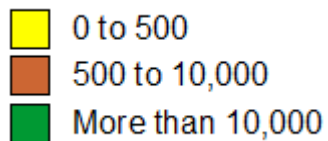
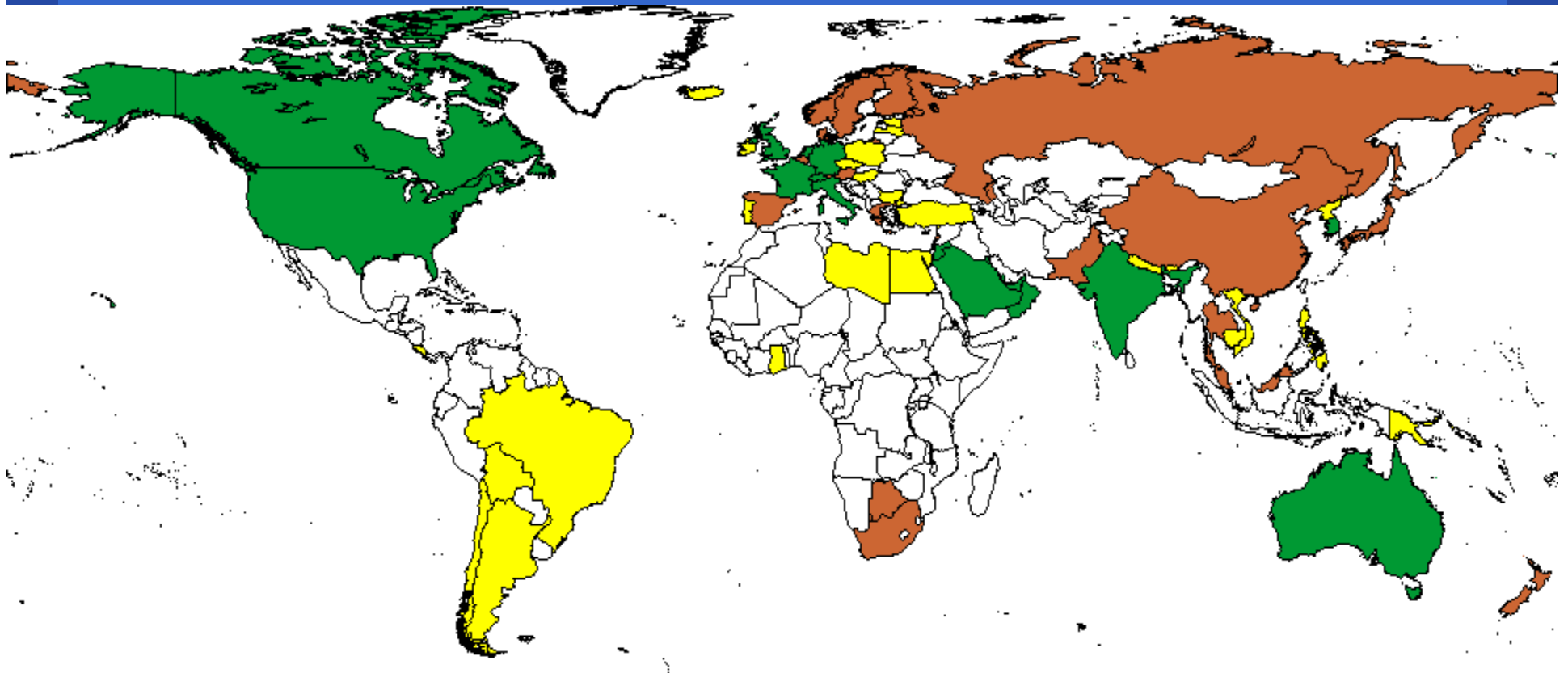
# Women and Migration



- Globally, women comprises slightly less than half (48%) of all international migrants
- The percentage was highest in Europe
- Male migrants outnumber female migrants by far in Asia (57%)

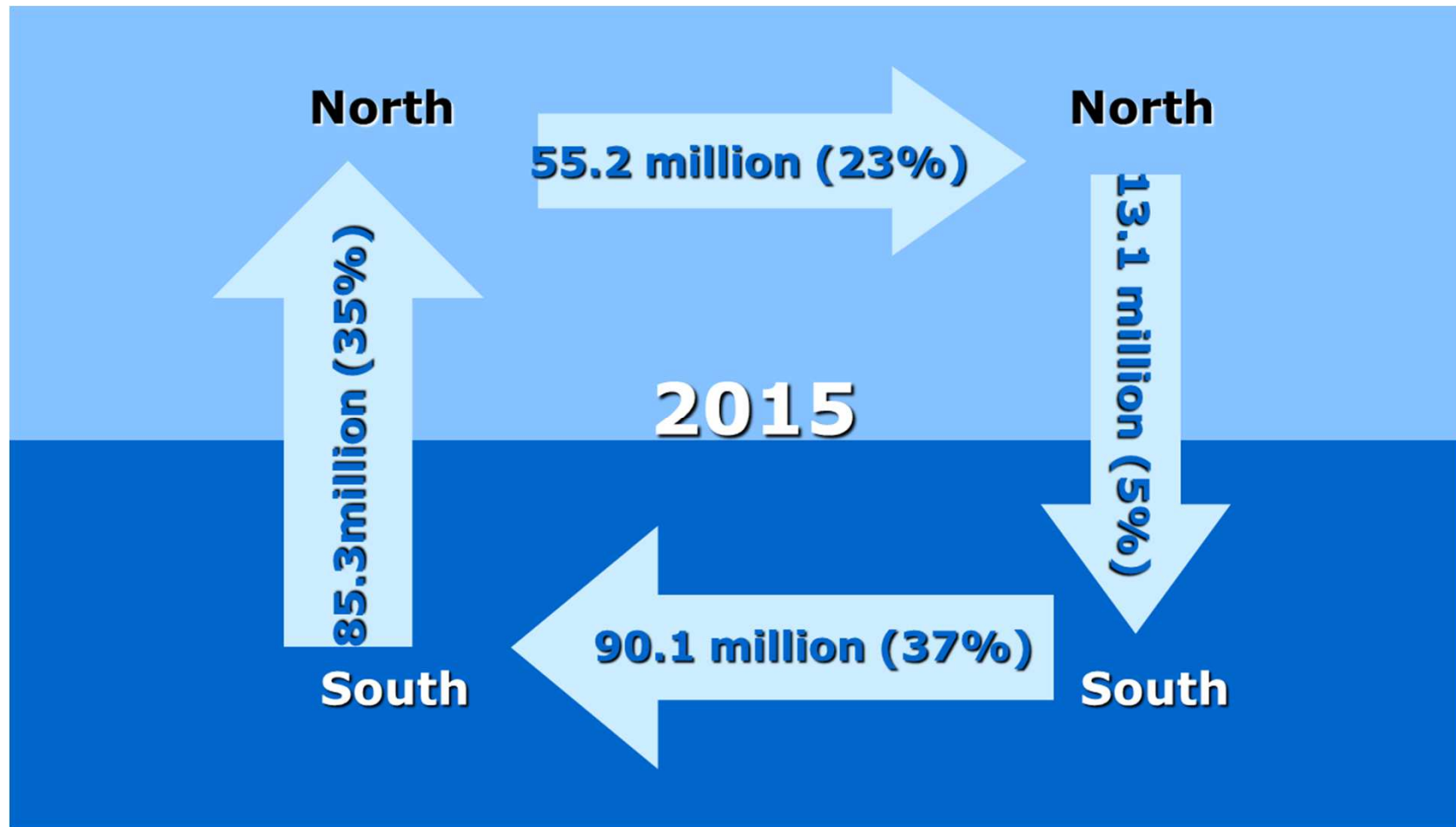


# Sri Lanka as a country of origin

# Conclusions

- Population censuses allow to produce highly comparable global indicator on international migration (migrant stock)
- Significantly untapped potential for analysis when properly disaggregated (age, sex, country of birth/citizenship, level of education, occupation etc.)
- Scope for data exchange by country of birth/citizenship (diaspora profiles)
- Ensure data availability from 2020 round of population and housing censuses
