### Global Compact - Objective 1

- OBJECTIVE 1: Collect and utilize accurate and disaggregated data as a basis for evidence-based policies
  - strengthen the global evidence base on international migration by improving and investing in the collection, analysis and dissemination of
    - accurate,
    - reliable,
    - comparable data,
    - disaggregated by sex, age, migration status and other characteristics
  - relevant in national contexts, while upholding the right to privacy under international human rights law and protecting personal data.



### Global Compact - Objective 1 - 11 Actions

- > STRENGHTEN comprehensive strategy for improving migration data at local, national, regional and global levels
- ▶ IMPROVE international comparability and compatibility of migration statistics and
- ▶ **DEVELOP** a global programme to build and enhance national capacities in data collection, analysis and dissemination national data systems
- COLELCT, ANALYZE AND USE data on the effects and benefits of migration, as well as the contributions
- SUPPORT further development of and collaboration between existing global and regional databases and depositories
- ► ESTABLISH AND STRENGHTEN Regional centres for research and training on migration or migration observatories



### Global Compact - Objective 1 - 11 Actions

- ► IMPROVE national data collection by integrating migration-related topics in national censuses
- ► CONDUCT household, labour force and other surveys
- ► ENHANCE collaboration between State units
- ▶ **DEVELOP AND USE** country-specific migration profiles
- ► COOPEARTE with relevant stakeholders in countries of origin, transit and destination to develop research, studies and surveys



### Global Compact - Other Objectives

- ► OBJECTIVE 4: Ensure that all migrants have proof of legal identity and adequate documentation
- OBJECTIVE 8: Save lives and establish coordinated international efforts on missing migrants
- ▶ OBJECTIVE 9: Strengthen the transnational response to smuggling of migrants
- ▶ OBJECTIVE 17: Eliminate all forms of discrimination and promote evidence-based public discourse to shape perceptions of migration




## Second World Data Forum - High-Level Panel on Migration Statistics - The Way Forward

Under-Secretary General for Economic and Social Affairs, DESA (22 October 2018, Dubai, United Arab Emirates):

- "...There is a paucity of basic data on international migration, and existing data are not fully utilized or shared.
- ► For example, 17 per cent of countries in Africa and 12 per cent in Asia have not produced official statistics on the number of international migrants since 2005. ..."







## Need for timely, reliable, accessible and comparable data

- Analyze key trends
- Identify challenges
- Design responses
- Monitor implementation and
- Evaluate effects of migration programmes and policies



#### Next steps at the United Nations

- > First half of 2019: GA to negotiate modalities of 2022 IMRF
- 27 February 2019: High-level debate on international migration and development as part of "migration week"
- > 5-8 March 2019: UN Statistical Commission, incl. migration
- > 1-5 April 2019: CPD: contribution of ICPD to 2030 Agenda
- 9-18 July 2019: High-Level Political Forum under ECOSOC
  - Empowering people and ensuring inclusiveness and equality
  - Goal 4 (education), 8 (employment), 10 (inequalities), 13 (climate change), 16 (justice) and 17 (implementation)
  - 51 national voluntary reviews from Africa (18), Asia & Pacific (16), Europe (11) and Latin America & Caribbean (6)

- 27-29 March 2019: Sixth Asia Pacific Forum for Sustainable Development
- > 1-5 April 2019: CPD: contribution of ICPD to 2030 Agenda
- > 27-31 May 2019: 75<sup>th</sup> session of the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific
- Strengthen the evidence base (capacity-development, analysis)
- > 2020 Asia-Pacific Migration Report
