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
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Time-use surveys in Latin America and the Caribbean

- Latin America has a great experience in the conceptual and methodological development of time-use measurement.
- The Latin America and the Caribbean possesses a regional classifier for the time-use surveys, the Classification of Time-Use Activities for Latin America and the Caribbean (CAUTAL) which was adopted in 2015 by the Statistical Conference of the Americas of ECLAC at its eight meeting.
- This instrument has already been used by quite a number of Latin American countries: Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Paraguay and the Plurinational State of Bolivia, among others.








Time-use surveys in Latin America and the Caribbean

Countries have mainly adopted stylized questions rather than diaries.



- Colombia, Ecuador, Mexico and Peru had built satellite accounts.
- El Salvador, Guatemala, Costa Rica and Uruguay had valued unpaid work.
- Uruguay has used the data to create and monitor their integrated national care system.
- El Salvador has used the information to promote public policy on care.

• There is heterogeneity both in the number of questions used and in the comprehensiveness of activities.

Agree on a level of aggregation of activities. The agreed "list of activities"




- could be the base for designing stylized questions or light diaries.
