Light time diary



- Matrix listing predefined list of activities and time intervals
- Respondents need to indicate the time of the day/ the time intervals when those activities were undertaken

 Experiences indicate that about 30 activities might constitute a practical upper level

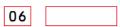

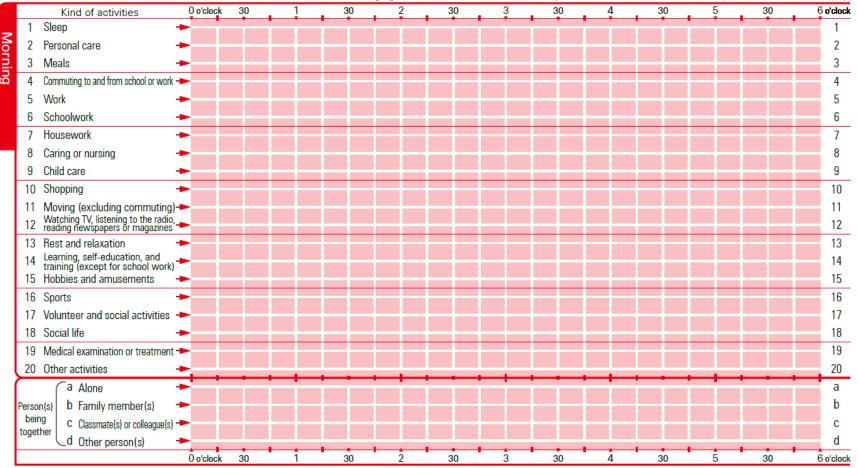

Light time diary



Advantages

- Less cost -> less coding
- Less time processing

Respondent:

- More manageable
- Less time consuming
- Require less degree of literacy of respondents

Challenges

Bias to the specified activities

 Less detailed information, including contextual information Light diaries in the world
