


Covid-19 Impact on CRS

- There was no major impact from the perspective of the Barbados Registration Department.
 - Barbados was on 24 hour lock down April 2nd – May 3rd, 2020, during this period, registrations were only accepted for deaths, consequently there were no births registered in April, as this process was delayed until May.
- What should be noted is that there were minor delays in the initial stages with respect to the collection of births. However, this quickly normalized.
- Therefore, there were no direct changes implemented. However, registrations were facilitated using a national Surname-Based Scheduling System, as per the Government approved protocols.




Deaths Jan-Oct 2019 and Jan- Oct 2020






Births Jan-Oct 2019 and Jan – Oct 2020

Monthly marriages between April and September 2020 were significantly reduced due to covid-19 restrictions, as well as low levels of tourist arrivals.



Divorces 2019 and 2020

- Information on divorces is collected in an aggregated form and provided annually.
- 2019 divorces were 422.
- The 2020 information for divorces is not yet available.



CR-VS System

- The civil registry and vital statistics systems generate statistics based on both the date of occurrence and on the date of registration.
- Both dates are recorded and submitted to the Barbados Statistical Service (NSO) for the processing of vital statistics.
- The CR-VS System is partially digitised; excluding data capture. An online portal for data exchange has been created and will be rolled out to our pilot agencies for testing in the near future. These agencies include:
 - Registration Department (CRS)
 - Immigration Department
 - Barbados Revenue Authority
 - National Insurance Scheme
 - Financial Services Commission
