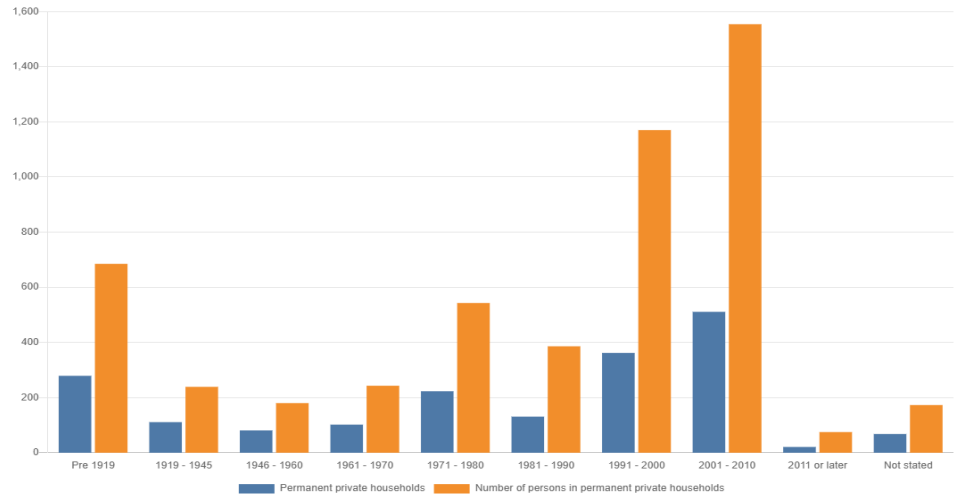

Dissemination – Good practice

- Increased visualization of outputs to achieve wide outreach
 - Infographics and charts– wide outreach to society, media and education sector
 - Maps : thematic and customized mapping application
 - story maps
 - integrates maps, legends, text, photos, and video
 - layered maps
- Geo-targeting and profiling of outputs
- Critical use of common agreed GeoCodes across NSO and government agencies



Dissemination – New horizons

Artificial Intelligence

- Production of outputs from tabular data in NSO
 - Resource savings
 - Internal controls
- External use of AI
 - Expand use of census data
 - Proactive in dealing with misinformation



Dissemination – Access to microdata

- Existing approach
 - Specialist researchers
 - Research Microdata File access to accredited users in controlled settings
- Future
 - Public access to generate tables and datasets from census microdata
 - Flexible table builder software – UK Census
 - Access Anonymised microdata to create tables/datasets
 - Statistical Disclosure Control runs in real time



Enhance value of census

Linkage to administrative data

- Good to highlight use cases
 - Excess mortality analysis – deaths post census
 - At risk of poverty at small area – income
- Linkage to administrative data sources at earliest stage in collection or processing
