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# **Analytical treatment of simultaneous activities**

### No international agreement - Options based on UN Guide 2005

# **Analytical treatment of simultaneous activities**

### No international agreement - Options based on UN Guide 2005

One hour of folding laundry as a primary activity and providing supervisory childcare during that same hour (while the child was taking a nap).

Adult women spend on average 10 hours a week folding laundry and 20 hours a week supervising children (as sole activities) (1/3 and 2/3)

The value of domestic work is \$15 per hour and the value of babysitting is \$5 per hour (3/4 and 1/4)

En total, considerando cuidados pasivos, las mujeres dedican en promedio **15.9 horas semanales más** al cuidado que los hombres. Excluyendo cuidados pasivos, la brecha se reduce a **6.9 horas**.

The **total work** time allows for a more comprehensive analysis of **all forms of work** and to shed light on the **gender division of labour**. The total work shows women and men contribution to societies and economies through their production of services and goods. Time-use data can reveal the unequal distribution of paid and unpaid work time (and the benefits associated with each type of work) due to gender norms and roles and unequal power relations.
