	Session 7 – The role of the census in population data systems
09:00 - 11:00	This session will discuss the role of the population and housing census as a foundational component of integrated population data systems. By integrating census data with other data sources such as surveys, geospatial information, administrative records and alternative data sources, countries can generate population estimates, projections, and a wide range of socio-demographic indicators on a regular/frequent basis. Addressing challenges related to data linkage, governance, and quality control is essential to optimize the value of these systems. The session will examine strategies for building effective population data systems, drawing on national experiences and addressing the evolving data landscape in preparation for the 2030 census round.
