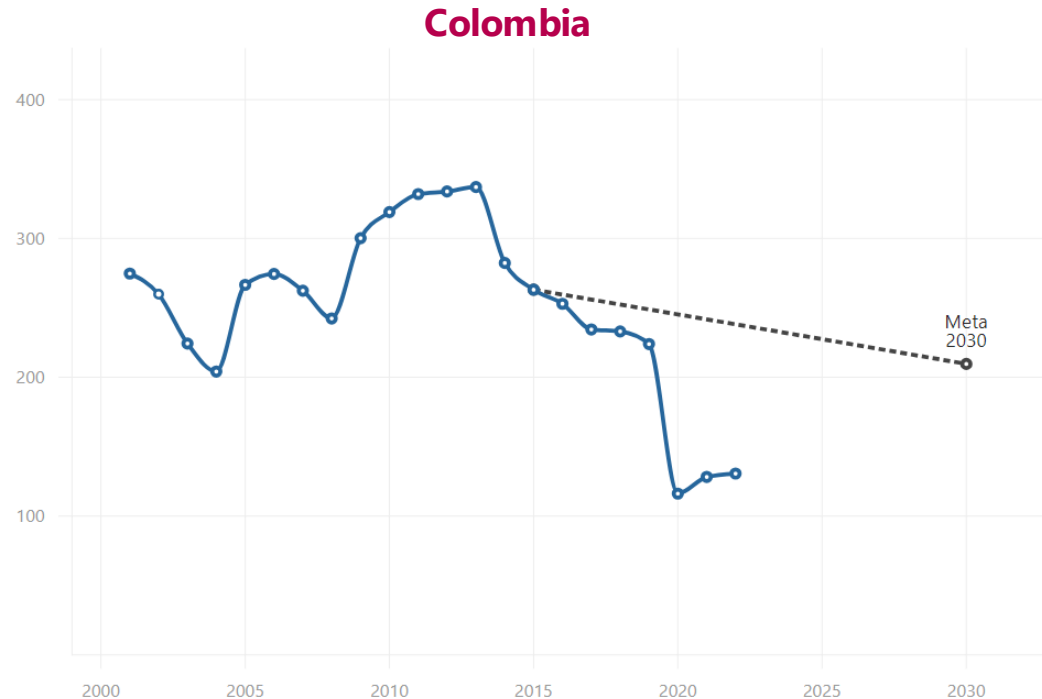

6.3 Percentage of women aged 13 to 49 who have ever experienced physical sexual violence by a partner or partner to have relations or perform sexual acts

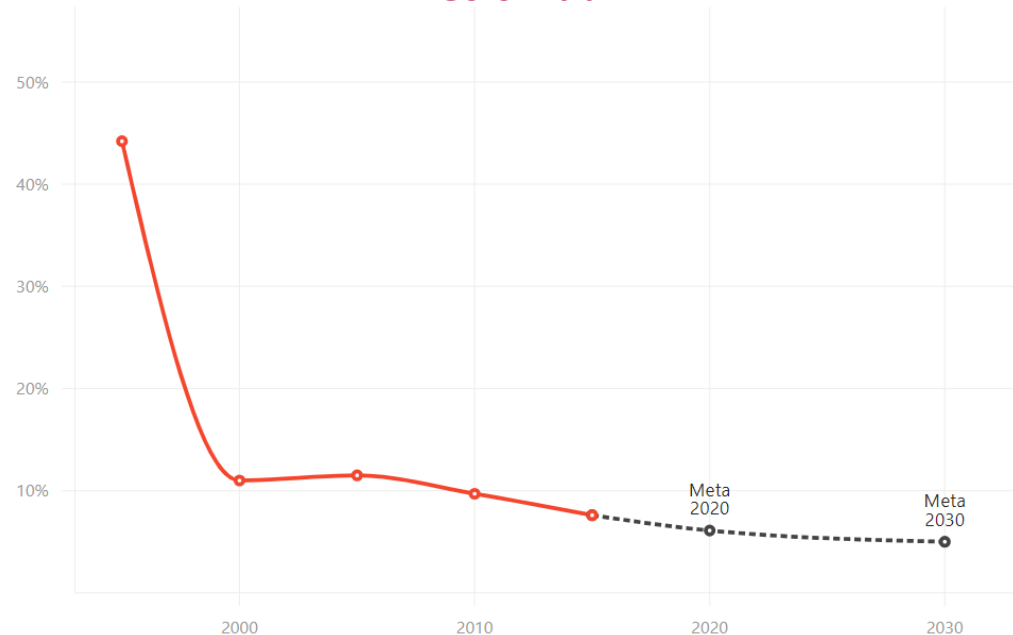

Measuring migration status or condition, to the prevalence of the migratory phenomenon, statistical representativeness is low.

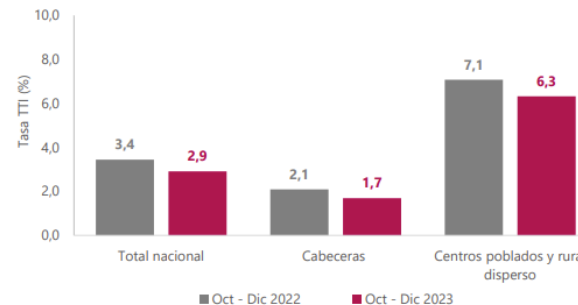

6.5 Number of victims of human trafficking per 100,000 inhabitants

No official sources

According to Colombian legislation, human trafficking is a crime that consists of the recruitment, transfer, harboring or receipt of people inside or outside the national territory for the purposes of exploiting them. Taking into account that the exploitation of people is equivalent to objectifying and commercializing them, this crime is also a violation of human rights and a violation of dignity. In Colombia the following exploitation purposes are recognized:

- The prostitution of others or other forms of sexual exploitation,
- Forced labor or services,
- Slavery or practices analogous to slavery,
- Servitude,
- The exploitation of other people's begging,
- The servile marriage,
- The removal of organs,
- Sex tourism
- Other forms of exploitation



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
