Current official statistics on international mobility produced by ONS

Long-term international migration estimates (LTIM)

- Official estimates of migrants arriving in or leaving the UK for 12 months or more.
- Immigration, emigration and net migration by EU, non-EU and British nationality and reason for migration.

Travel and Tourism estimates

- Official estimates of the number of visits overseas by UK residents and their spending abroad, and the number of visits to the UK by foreign residents and their spending in the UK.
- Number of completed visits (not visitors) that lasted for a period of less than 12 months.

Using UK Census Data to produce estimates on temporary international mobility

ONS Publications

• <u>The changing picture of short-term international migration, England and Wales: Census 2021</u> – published March 2023

TMIs it can measure

- Number of foreign citizens temporarily present in the UK who are
- Engaged in other types of employment
- Engaged in training or education

Limitations

- Only produce every ten years
- Can be used for stocks but not for flows
- Limited analysis of additional temporary mobility indicators can be conducted

Survey-based data: International Passenger Survey (IPS)

Short-Term International Migration for England and Wales: year ending June 2019 – published May 2021

TMIs it can measure

- Annual number of foreign citizens entering the UK temporarily for
- Cross-border work
- Seasonal work
- Other types of employment
- Training or education
- Health-related treatments
- Annual number of resident foreign citizens and UK citizens departing the UK for temporary stays abroad

Limitations

- · Based on number of visits rather than number of visitors
- Subject to sampling and non-sampling errors
- Data could not be published until 23 months after the mid-year to which it refers
- · Will no longer collect arrival data

Admin-based data: Home Office Borders and Immigration (HOBI)

TMIs it can measure

- Annual number of foreign nationals entering the UK temporarily for
- Cross-border work
- Seasonal work
- Other types of employment
- Training or education
- Asylum seekers/refugees
- Annual number of resident foreign nationals departing the UK for temporary stays abroad

Limitations

- · Can be used for flows but not stocks
- Cannot measure British nationals
- Cannot identify those who have entered the UK on one type of visa but engaged in activities usually permitted under another type of visa
- Cannot do local level analysis

Other data sources for measuring temporary international mobility

Registration and Population Interaction Database (RAPID)

- Provides information on employment length
- Predominantly for stocks but can derive the implied flows

Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA)

Provides information on length of study for international students

Transformed Labour Market Survey (TLFS)

- Information on seasonal workers
- Only provides information on those in the country for at least 6 months

Flow – Annual number of resident departing the country for temporary stays abroad

- Foreign nationals
- British nationals

Summary (2 of 2) – Additional temporary mobility indicators that cannot be measured

Stock - Number of foreign nationals temporarily present in the country who are:

- Cross-border workers
- Seeking health-related treatments
- Asylum seekers/refugees

Stock – Number of British nationals temporarily absent from the country who are:

- Cross-border workers
- Engaged in seasonal work

Flow – Annual number of foreign nationals entering the country temporarily for:

Flow – Annual number of resident _____ departing the country for temporary stays abroad
