Modernisation requires decisions about the main methods of registering activities, discussion of the role of data protection and privacy specific to modernised tools, and elaboration of the potential of geolocation tools. In the context of modernizing their national statistical systems, NSOs are exploring alternative ways of collecting time-use data involving the use of technology resulting in digitalization of data collections. 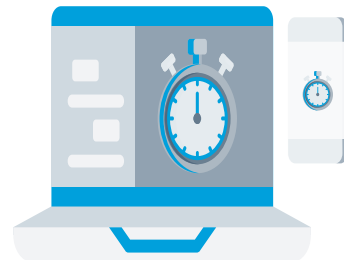
