



International Migration and Population Projections



- ✓ International migration has been used as an assumption for Indonesian population projection since 2015.
- ✓ The assumption of international migration at Population Projection 2015-2045 shows that level of international migration in 2015 is -0.5 for the two scenarios developed. It tends to decline until 2045.

Indonesia's Action Plan on Global Migration Agreement

Global Compact for Safe, Orderly & Regular Migration (GCM)

Based on the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants which was adopted at the 71st General Assembly of the United Nations in 2016.

Agreed by consensus at the Intergovernmental Conference on the GCM (IGC GCM) meeting, December 10-11 2018 in Marrakesh, Morocco. At the meeting, the Indonesian Minister of Foreign Affairs became Vice President representing the Asia Pacific region.

On 19 December 2018, the GCM was ratified by the United Nations through a Resolution (A/RES/73/195) which was ratified by voting with the support of 152 countries.



- Objectives: (1) to provide guidelines for good, orderly, safe migration management; (2) strengthen cooperation in the field of migration; (3) strengthen capacity to deal with non-regular migration.
- The 23 target objectives
 (objectives) are very closely related to the target of SDG 10.7.
- 10 prinsip dasar : People centered international cooperation National sovereignty Rule of law & due process sustainable development pelindungan HAM Gender responsive Child sensitive whole-of-government approach & whole-of-society approach

society approach.
To ensure the implementation of GCM documents at the technical level, GCM supporting countries need to develop a National Action Plan.

Progress of the Preparation of a National Action Plan

Indonesia needs to protect Indonesian citizens without exception, including those working abroad

GCM implementation is proof of Indonesia's commitment to improve the quality of global migration governance

The National Action Plan will become a reference document for national stakeholders to ensure that GCM implementation can be carried out in detail and measurably

The preparation of a National Action Plan for the implementation of GCM is still in progress:

- the discussion has been carried out 5 times → finalization of the matrix on 31/8.
- the draft Presidential Regulation is also being discussed as the legal umbrella for the National Action Plan in parallel.

The process of preparing the Draft Presidential Regulation is currently still ongoing and is expected to soon enter the harmonization stage.

Implementation of the National Action Plan in the field has actually started because almost all program activities listed in the National Action Plan document are activities that are already owned and carried out by each supporting ministry and agency.




