Progress Declaration

70. We request the Secretary-General, in his next biennial report, to propose, for the consideration of Member States, <u>a limited set of indicators</u>, drawing on the global indicator framework for the Sustainable Development Goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda [...], to assist Member States, upon their request, in conducting inclusive reviews of progress related to the implementation of the Global Compact, as well as to include a comprehensive strategy for improving <u>disaggregated migration data at the local, national, regional and global levels.</u>

Minimize the adverse drivers & structural factors that compel people to leave their country of origin

- A diversity of drivers and a broad range of policies
- How do we assess the impact of targeted interventions on people's propensity to move?



Enhance availability & flexibility of pathways for regular migration

- Different governance levels : bilateral, regional, multilateral
- Different policy areas: skills, labour, humanitarian, natural disasters...
- What do we want to measure: number of agreements? number of beneficiaries?



Empower migrants & societies to realize full inclusion & social cohesion

- Multidimensional objective that involves many non-migration sectoral policies (education, labour, health, social protection...)
- Should we focus on output (policies) or outcome (migrants' integration) indicators?
- Data disaggregation: age, sex, diversity...
