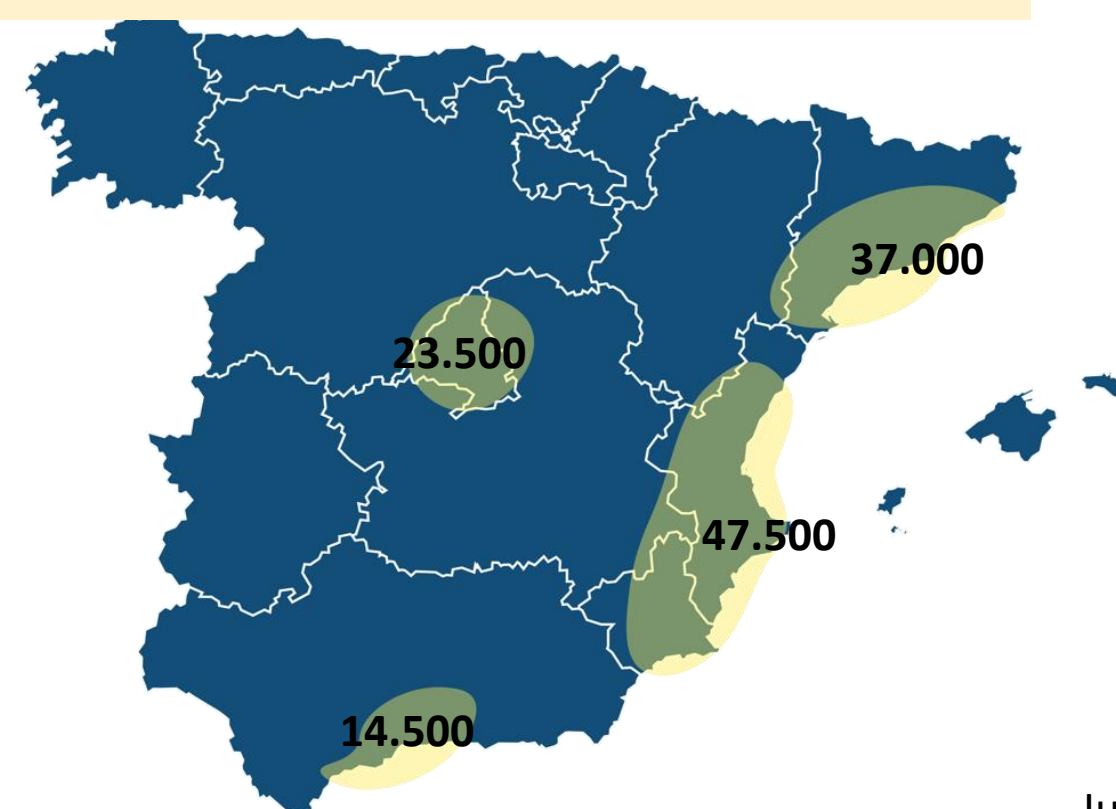

Basic socio-demographic profile registered at emergency reception centers (CREADEs) in real time

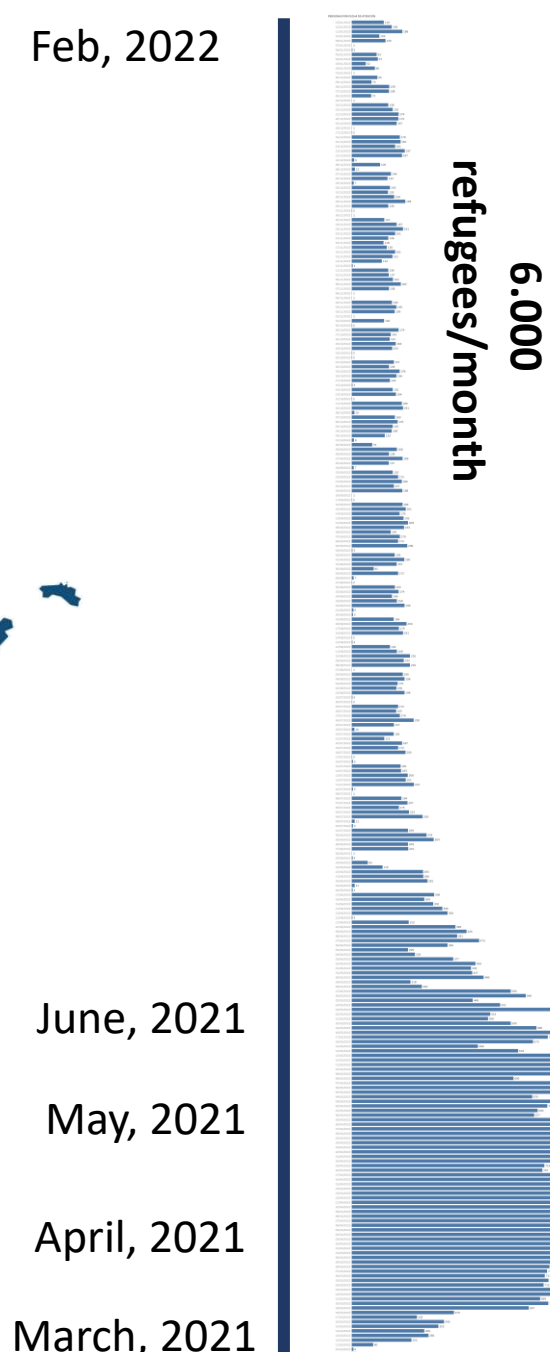
165.000 Ukrainian Refugees

9% from Kharkiv, 7% from L'viv & 8 from Odessa



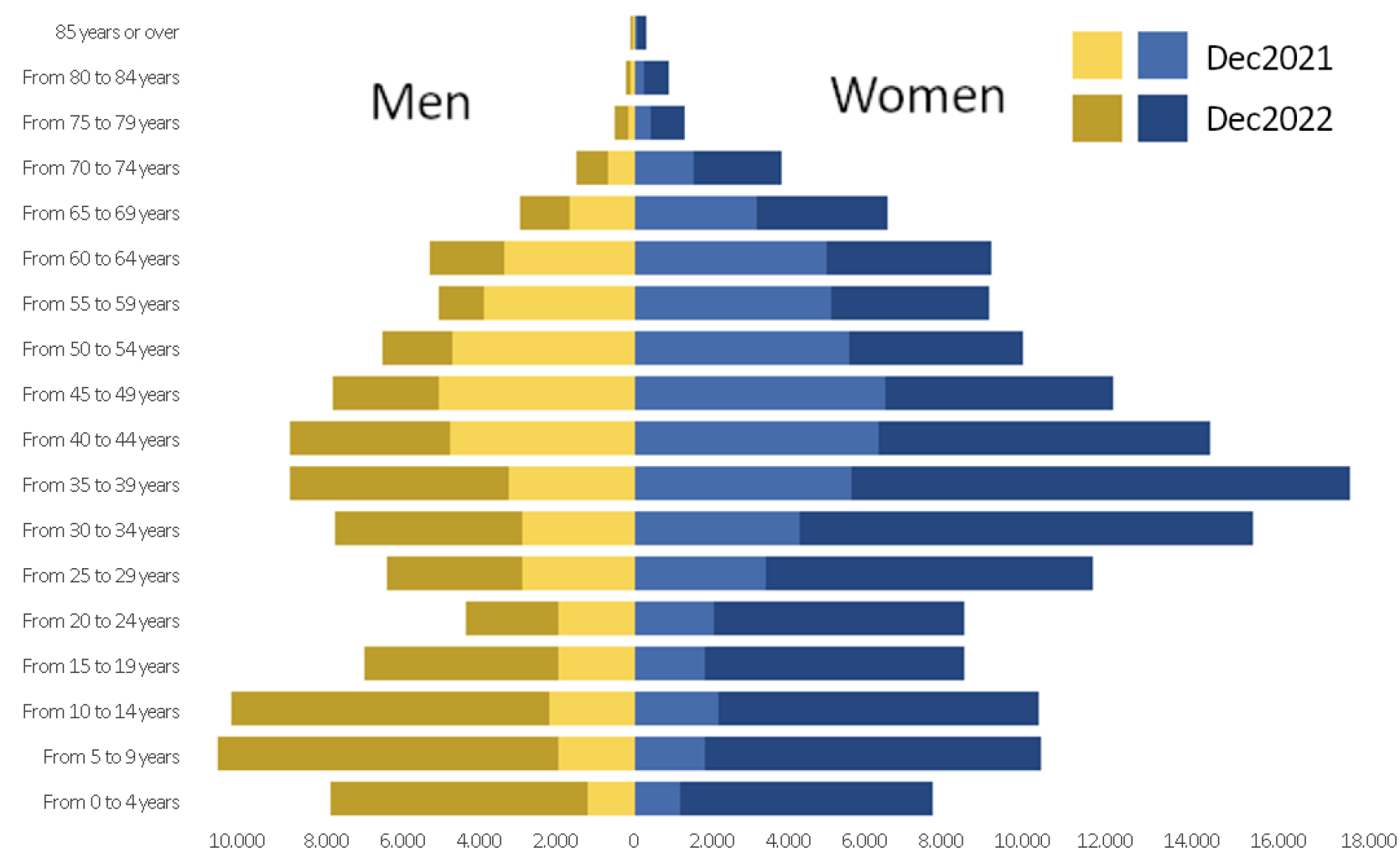

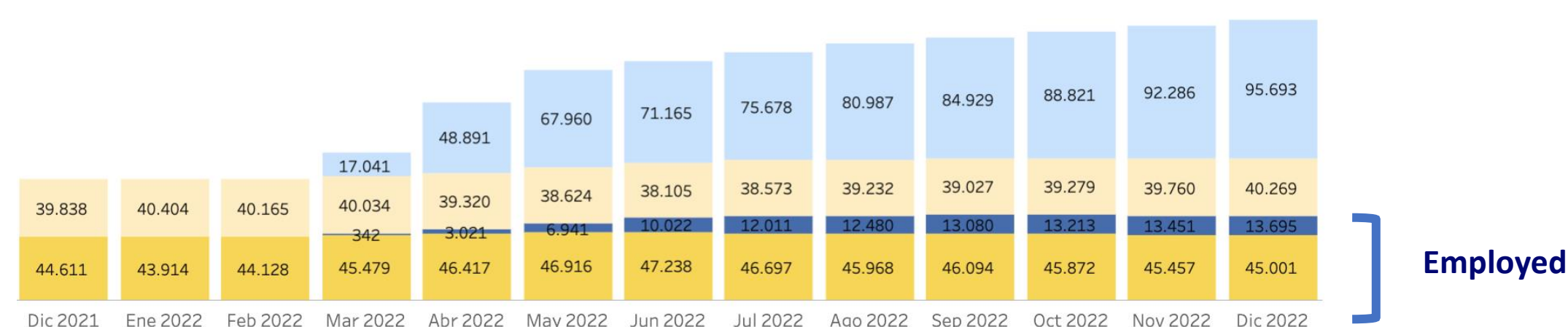

Pre-war Ukrainian community in Spain and recent refugees widely differ in their demographic profile: mainly working age population versus young adult women and children



Regular employment of Ukrainian refugees steadily increased up to August 2022, but no substantial improvement is perceived since then

Main areas of employment for Ukrainians in Spain are construction, cleaning services and hospitality. Among recent refugees, hospitality is first ranked, and sales, communications & administrative services are also relevant
