## **Reporting Country : Canada Reporting Year : 2002**

All estimates from 1996 on are 1996 Census-based and will be REPLACED with 2001 Census-based data during the last few months of 2003. The 1997-2001 estimates will be converted from postcensal to intercensal estimates with 2001 Census boundaries. Updated data for past years (1998-2001) are provided in the attached file "1998-2001 Data".

#### Table 1:

Rural and urban population distributions can only be derived from Census data. Rural/urban distributions for intercensal and postcensal population estimates based on adjusted Census counts are not available.

Rural and urban population figures in United Nation Yearbook for 1996 are incorrect since both figures are higher than the estimated population for Canada as a whole.

#### Table 2:

Population estimates for July 1, 2002 are preliminary postcensal estimates based on 1996 adjusted Census counts. Estimates based on the 2001 adjusted Census counts (1997-2001 intercensal estimates and 2002+ postcensal) will become available by November 2003.

Ages shown in 90-94 cells are for ages 90+.

Intercensal and postcensal population estimates for rural and urban populations by age and sex are not available. Only census counts for urban and rural populations during census years are available and the combined totals would not correspond to population estimates which are based on adjusted census counts (net-census undercoverage, July 1<sup>st</sup> reference date, and non enumerated Indian Reserves).

Table 3:

Demography Division of Statistics Canada has temporarily ceased production of Census Subdivision (CSD) population estimates (cities, towns, villages, etc.) until 2001 Census-based estimates with 2001 Census boundaries are produced. By November-December 2003, Demography Division will recommence the production of CSD estimates

For urban agglomerations, population counts of Census Agglomerations (CAs) can only be derived from the census. Postcensal and intercensal population estimates for Census Metropolitan Areas (CMAs) are produced by Demography Division of Statistics Canada. The CMA population estimates provided in Table 3 are 1996 Census-based with 1996 Census boundaries and hence will be replaced by 2001 Census-based estimates later this year

CMA estimates for Ottawa-Gatineau (formerly known as Ottawa-Hull) are provided.

The CMA of Chicoutimi-Jonquière is now known as Saguenay.

Population estimates for July 1, 2002 are preliminary postcensal estimates based on 1996 adjusted Census counts. Estimates based on the 2001 adjusted Census counts (1997-2001 intercensal estimates and 2002+ postcensal) will become available by November 2003.
