HOUSEHOLD is any kind of family or other type of community with persons who live together and spend their income on essentials for living (housing, food, etc.), whether all members are constantly in the place where household is or some of them are temporarily living in some other settlement, or abroad, due to work, schooling or some other reasons.

A household is also every person who lives alone, without combining with any other person to form another multi-person household, so-called *one-person household*, whether a person occupy the whole or a part of conventional dwelling, living in a hotel for single persons or as a subtenant.

A household is also so called. *collective households*, which is a household composed of persons who live in social welfare institutions for children and adults, in monasteries, convents, hospitals for incurable patients, etc.

D. Housing census characteristics

1. Housing information

What definition did you apply in this census for housing unit?

A **housing unit** is a separate and independent place of abode intended for habitation. Except for conventional dwellings, the Census covered also rooms that did not correspond to the definition of a dwelling, but were used at the time of the Census for habitation (occupied business premises and premises occupied out of need), as well as collected housing units (collective dwellings) intended for cohabitation of several persons.

What definition did you apply in this census for conventional dwelling?

A **conventional dwelling** is taken to be a construction structure intended for habitation whether it was used at the moment of the Census for: only habitation; both habitation and performing an activity; only performing an activity; rest and recreation, or to be also a non-occupied but fit construction structure. A dwelling has one or more rooms with auxiliary facilities (kitchen, pantry, hall, bathroom, toilet, etc.) or none. It may have one or more separate entries.

Are vacant units included in the enumerated conventional dwellings?

Yes.

What definition did you apply in this census for room?

The **room** is defined as the space within the housing unit which is surrounded by walls, which extend from floor to ceiling or roof, of at least 2 meters above the floor, of sufficient size to contain a bed for adults (at least 4 square meters).
