# Draft International Classification of Activities for Time Use Statistics

### Introduction

The starting point for the draft International Classification of Activities for Time-Use Statistics (ICATUS) is the two-digit trial classification adopted by the Expert Group Meeting on Trial International Classification for Time-Use Activities (13-16 October 1997, United Nations). The present draft classification provides a more detailed delineation of categories of activities. It consists of 15 main categories which are further divided into divisions totaling 195. Forty-three of the divisions are further divided into a total of 208 groups.

The new classification is based on a consideration of the experiences of countries in applying the trial classification as well as experiences in the use of other activity classifications for data collection on time-use.

This document explains the purpose and nature of the draft classification, the principles used in constructing the classification, the structure and coding system adopted for it, and some considerations in applying the classification. It also presents the detailed classification.

### Purpose and nature of the classification

The draft ICATUS is a step toward promoting the collection and compilation of data on paid and unpaid work. Two main issues that it specifically addresses are:

- Better measurement of production of goods by household members for own final use.
   These involve activities considered as work within the production boundary of the
   System of National Accounts (SNA) but are generally underestimated in labour force statistics, and
- Better identification of SNA work in informal sector enterprises. Many of these activities are not covered well in data collection on economic activity for several reasons—women and men who engage in such activities may not consider these as work because they are perceived as too small-scale, of subsistence-level, of short duration or seasonal, or because many of these activities may actually be done as part of production of services for own final use (e.g., cooking food for both the household and for sale); designers of surveys may not identify these accurately in operational definitions and in survey instruments; enumerators may have inadequate knowledge of what these activities are and may impose their own biases and judgments in recording them.

The draft ICATUS seeks to provide a comprehensive categorization of activities associated with household production of goods for own final use and informal sector activities. These activities are an important component of the work of women and to some degree men in developing countries but are not defined in most classifications of activities for data collection on time use.

While this classification has a stronger emphasis on economic activities which often are not perceived as such, it is built on existing national and regional classifications of time-use activity and is consistent with the historical data sets that are based on these schemes.

### Principles used for constructing the classification

### **Categories**

The first criterion for differentiating between activities is with respect to the relationship they bear to the production boundary of the System of National Accounts (SNA). On this basis, three types of activities are defined:

- Activities done in relation to production within the SNA production boundary; that is, "SNA work" activities
- Activities done in relation to production activities within the general production boundary but outside the SNA production boundary, or "non-SNA work" activities and
- Activities that are not considered as production activities, as determined by the "third person principle" which excludes from production activities that cannot be produced by one person for the benefit of another

These three types of activities are allocated into main categories based on different criteria. SNA work activities are first categorized based on the institutional unit in which production takes place. These institutional units are: corporations/quasi-corporations, non-profit institutions, government, and households. All work activities in corporations/quasi-corporations, non-profit institutions, and government are combined into one main category. Work activities in household enterprises are further delineated on the basis of the character of the goods and services produced by the activities undertaken and main categories are defined in terms of groupings of the 1993 ISIC economic activities. Thus, SNA work activities are classified into the following main categories:

- A. Work for corporations/quasi-corporations, non-profit institutions, and government; that is, work in the "formal" sector
- B. Work for household enterprises in primary production activities (activities done in relation to agriculture, forestry, hunting, fishing, mining and quarrying)
- C. Work for household enterprises in non-primary production activities (activities done in manufacturing of goods)
- D. Work for household enterprises in construction activities (activities done in construction work)
- E. Work for household enterprises providing services for income (activities done in relation to providing services for income)

Non-SNA work activities are further delineated in terms of whether they are done for household members or for members of other households/community. The resulting categories are:

F. Work providing unpaid domestic services for own final use within household

- G. Work providing unpaid care-giving services to household members
- H. Work providing community services and help to other households

Non-production activities are further distinguished according to the nature of the activity and participation of others. Applying these criteria results in the following categories of activities:

- I. Learning
- J. Socializing and community participation
- K. Attending/visiting cultural, entertainment and sports events/venues
- L. Engaging in hobbies, games and other pastime activities
- M. Indoor and outdoor sports participation
- N. Use of mass media
- O. Personal care and maintenance

### Divisions and groups

Activities within the broad categories are further distinguished by allocating activities into divisions. Divisions comprise both core activities pertaining to the category and non-core or related activities. Traveling is uniformly treated as a related activity at the division level within a category. In addition, some categories include divisions comprised of other related activities.

For SNA work activities, core activities are defined as the activities done as part of performing one's job or as part of "working time". Related activities are those that are conceptually related by the labour force statistics framework (looking for work, training and studies at work).

Work in "formal" sector enterprises are further delineated based on whether the work is done as part of main job and other jobs. To be consistent with the labour statistics framework, specifically the definition of working hours, work activities of apprentices, interns and related positions and activities done during short breaks at work are also classified in this category. Other activities that occur in the workplace in formal sector enterprises outside of the usual working time comprise another division in this category. The desired result is a complete picture of activities that occur in the workplace.

SNA work activities in household enterprises are further delineated within the broad categories by divisions described in terms of the International Standard Industrial Classification of Economic Activities (ISIC, Rev. 3). As a rule, the divisions highlight those economic activities which are typically undertaken as part of own household production and those associated with the informal sector. Activities undertaken by individuals generally correspond to tasks that may be described by the listings in appropriate occupational categories in ISCO 88; in the draft classification these are classified according to the type of economic activity in which the task is being undertaken.

In determining whether further distinctions need to be made among activities in the other main categories by forming divisions or groups, the criteria applied are relative importance of the activities to be included and the frequency and regularity of occurrence. In general, a major consideration in forming separate divisions or groups is the importance of the activities to be included to the objectives of time-use analysis. Separate groups are also provided for kinds of activities that are prevalent in most countries. Another consideration is that of attaining international comparability at the division level of the classification.

### Structure and coding system of the classification

The draft ICATUS consists of 15 main categories and as indicated in the previous section are given alphabetic labels by letters A to O. Each category consists of eight or more divisions of which there are 195 in all. Forty-three of the divisions are further divided into a total of 208 groups.

The divisions are assigned three-digit codes and groups within divisions are assigned 4-digit codes. The first three digits of the 4-digit codes correspond to the division code. The use of three-digit codes at the first level (division level) of the classification is necessary in order to achieve the delineations of activities that are necessary to the purposes of the classification. The three-digit codes are grouped into clusters of 50 or 100 (e.g., 001-099, 100-149, etc).

Table 1 shows the structure of the classification at the division level.

### Categories A to E:

Categories corresponding to SNA work activities (categories A to E) are uniformly structured as follows:

- Working time activities
- Activities related to looking for work/ setting-up business
- Travel
- Activities not elsewhere classified

Working time activities comprise the core activities for each of these categories. Category A (Formal sector work) also includes activities pertaining to "short breaks and interruptions from work" as part of working time and activities pertaining to "Other breaks". These types of activities are however not identified for the categories corresponding to work in household enterprises (Categories B to E). The reason for this is that it is assumed that working time arrangements in household enterprises are generally less structured or more flexible compared to those in the formal sector. Thus, activities associated with such breaks from work are classified in the corresponding divisions and not within the category.

### Categories F to H:

Categories corresponding to non-SNA work (categories F to H) have the following uniform structure:

Working time activities

- Travel
- Activities not elsewhere classified

Working time activities comprise the core activities for each of these categories. In addition, category H (Providing community services and help to other households) allocates one division for non-core or related activities.

### Categories I to O:

Categories corresponding to non-production activities have the following uniform structure:

- Core activities
- Travel
- Activities not elsewhere classified

Core activities comprise all divisions in these categories except for category I (Learning) which allocates one division for non-core or related activities.

### Some considerations in applying the classification

A brief discussion of some considerations in applying the draft ICATUS follows:

### Contextual information.

Some dimensions of the context in which activities are carried out are built into the classification. The need for supplementary questions in the data collection instrument to capture this information should be considered. To illustrate:

- Category A activities are generally paid except possibly for "unpaid" contributing family workers and apprentices. To determine whether work is paid or unpaid, additional information will need to be collected.
- Category B activities may be paid or unpaid but "Paid domestic services" is defined as a specific division.
- Unpaid domestic work and care-giving activities are categorized separately depending on "for whom" the activity is done—whether it is for own household members (categories F and G) or for others (Category H). A contextual variable on "for whom" may be needed to be able to accurately classify the activity.
- Activities generally associated with unpaid volunteer work are placed in Category H.
- Computer technology is given some prominence with separate divisions (723, 831-833) defined. This is another implicit use of contextual information (technology used) in defining divisions and groups.

### Pairs of activities

Some activities may be intrinsically linked and comprise a single activity—eating generally goes with drinking or waiting for transport to traveling. In such cases, these pairs of activities are classified as a single activity without loss of important information. However, there are intrinsically linked activities which when treated as a single activity would result in loss of information about one of the linked activities. Important examples are: talking/conversing in relation to work, in attending meetings, or at social events where talking/conversing becomes "lost" as this would be classified under the other activity; watching video or listening to the radio strictly in relation to studying is "lost" under studying. In these cases, data collection designs may need to consider the use of primary and secondary or simultaneous activities as an additional dimension of the activity. Note that the draft classification includes "passive" childcare (354- Minding children) as a division to ensure that these activities are not necessarily subsumed under the other activity in the pair.

Cultural factors may however dictate the extent to which activities are combined or distinguished from another. In some countries setting a table may be a separate activity from meal preparation while in others they are combined. In other situations, such as with child care there may be no clear distinction between caring for children and playing games with them, while in other countries it would be rare for a parent to play with their children, and therefore this would be a different kind of activity recorded for individuals other than the parents. In such cases, coding instructions would need to include prioritization rules.

### Adapting the classification to country situations

The classification has been developed with a four-digit coding scheme with divisions comprising the 3-digit codes and groups the 4-digit codes. In some divisions, no specific groups have been defined. In defining specific groups under the divisions, the basic criterion is that of universality.

The detail required for an activity classification for time-use such as the present one may differ from country to country, and in many cases, as with past experiences the focus may be on a subset of the divisions covered by this classification. Given differences in the scope of activities and interests, this classification serves as a framework from which varying levels of detail may be derived. For example, the divisions on "travel" can be further expanded by defining groups according to the purpose of the travel. Or, some categories may be combined.

Countries requiring more detailed specification of the activities may adapt this classification for their purposes by expanding groups or defining classes under groups using five-digit codes. However, because of the complexities of collecting and analysing time-use data countries should note that too much detail may result in over-burdening respondents and complicating the coding process which may not necessarily lead to better data.

# A Work for corporations/quasi-corporations, non-profit institutions and government (formal sector work)

### Includes:

- All activities performed in relation to employment in corporations/quasi-corporations, non-profit institutions, and government; work typically associated with the formal sector
- Both paid and unpaid employment irrespective of the industrial sector of the activity and status in employment
- Work performed under apprenticeship, internship and on-the-job training programs
- Short breaks during working hours and waiting due to delays at work
- Participation in training and studies on official time
- Activities that are not directly related to one's job but are typically done while at the workplace or within the block of time that constitutes one's usual time in the workplace. These include idle time while waiting to begin work and shortly after work and lunch break or similar long breaks from work.
- Activities related to seeking employment or the setting-up of a business
- Includes travel to and from the work place.

### B Work for household enterprises in primary production activities

### Includes:

- All activities done in relation to the primary production of goods by household enterprises whether for market or for own final use. A person's activity is classified as primary production of goods if it is done in relation to the economic activities of agriculture, hunting, forestry, fishing, mining and quarrying.
- Activities done in relation to collecting, distributing and storing of water.
- Participation in meetings/training and studies directly related to one's work in primary production activities.
- Activities done in relation to acquiring inputs/supplies for work and disposing of outputs.
- Activities related to seeking employment and the setting-up of a business
  - Travel to and from the work place

<u>Note</u>: In these groups of activities it is assumed that working time arrangements are generally more informal or flexible compared to those in the formal sector. Thus, this category does not include specific groups for short breaks and for lunch breaks. Activities associated with such breaks from work are classified in the corresponding group; e.g. eating snack/meals is classified under 911-Eating meals/snack.
