Census information is needed for planning in important areas such as education, health, housing, business planning and investment. It is also used to help us understand how our society changes over time.

The information you provide must be kept confidential by Statistics New Zealand and is protected by the Statistics Act 1975. Census information can only be used for statistical purposes.

The Public Records Act 2000 requires census forms may be made available historical records. After 100 years census forms may be made available for research that meets the confidentiality requirements of the Statistics Act. The Public Records Act 2005 requires census forms be kept as 0800 236 787

Statistics New Zealand will also use census responses to select a small sample of people to participate in a survey on disability.
