Enumerator checklist**FIRST VISIT****Introduction**

1. Introduce yourself, show your identity card.
2. Ask for the head of household (or one who can act as head if the head is not present). Also, ask as many household members as possible to be present.
3. Tell the purpose of your visit and answer any questions.
4. Always be polite, patient and neutral.

First-round enumeration

5. Use a blue pen.
6. Start interview by filling in the header (complete every sheet used for that household).
7. Complete household questions (only on the first sheet used for that household).
8. Make an inventory of all people who slept there last night and order them in the proper sequence (use notepad and see section 3.2.3, point 7 in the manual).
9. Check whether you included everyone, also people who did night work, etc. (see section 2.5, point 2).
10. Fill in the information in questions P2 to P5 for all those present at census moment. If necessary use the historical calendar and the age-year conversion table in the manual.
11. Cross out those questions that do not apply to household members because they are males or because they are too young (see section 3.2.3, point 3 in the manual).
12. Complete the remaining individual questions person by person. If necessary use the historical calendar, the age-year conversion table and the children-ever-born listings in the manual, the Ward table on the folder and the Ward maps.
13. Complete question H18.
14. Complete the header (*This is sheet of sheets*).
15. Check that there are no empty questions for any of the respondents: they must either be filled in or crossed out.
16. Check the consistency of the answers where possible.
17. Copy the information from question H18 and the household number to Table D (census night) in the folder and sign there.
18. Attach a label to the house with the date and the EA and household number.
19. Ask the head of household to remember who slept in the household on the night of Sunday 21 to Monday 22 November. Give him/her a *Household record sheet* to write down their names.
20. Thank the people for their assistance and tell them that you will come back after census night.
21. Locate the next household in your EA and go there for the next interview.

SECOND VISIT**Second-round enumeration**

22. Use a red pen.
23. Make all corrections as indicated on the questionnaires by your supervisor.
24. Tick off who slept in the household on census night.
25. Add any new people and delete people who were not present. If the head did not sleep there, identify another head and adjust the relation to the head of any other household member.
26. Check whether there were any children born to one of the females listed, or whether any of their children died since your first visit. If so adjust question P29.
27. Adjust question H18 if necessary.
28. Adjust or complete the header if necessary.
29. Copy the information from question H18 and the household number to Table D (census night) in the folder and sign there.
30. Locate the next household in your EA and go there for the next interview.
31. Thank the people again for their assistance.

COMPLETION OF ENUMERATION

32. Check whether you filled in all required information on the questionnaires (in the headers and in the questions), on the folders, on the manual and on the notepad.
33. Arrange all sheets in the proper order, numbered 01 to 25 in each folder.
34. Hand all documents and all equipment over to your supervisor before 30 November and sign a sheet for reception.
