Latin America and the Caribbean

Biodiversity and habitat rich
Resource extraction intensive
Heterogeneous development of national statistics systems
Institutional structures and capacities vary considerably
Limited resources dedicated to statistical development (some exceptions)





Latin America and the Caribbean

- Colombia and Mexico's NSOs regularly compile environmental accounts
- Several countries have recently led or are initiating efforts:
 - Ministries of Environment: Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Panama
 - NSO: Brazil, Peru
 - Central Bank: Dominican Republic, Venezuela
 - University: Guatemala
- In more than 50% of countries National Accounts are compiled by Central Banks
- High potential for south-south cooperation



Important SEEA tools for the region

- Didactic and practical tools in regional languages
 - SEEA 2012, international recommendations, manuals, compiler guides, training material etc.
- Methodological material related to natural resource asset accounting
 - Manuals on forest and land accounts
- Core set of tables
- Adapted tool kit to regional requirements (diagnostic tools, guidelines for national implementation plans, etc.)



Important SEEA tools for the region

- The tools must be accompanied by training and technical assistance
- Capacity building strategy:
 - training of trainers
 - online courses
 - collaboration with universities to mainstream
 SEEA material in post-graduate programs

- UNITED NATIONS
- Essential to build a critical mass of SEEA practitioners in the region

ECLAC activities

•Strengthening ECLAC's capacity on SEEA to better serve member states

 Developing a regional strategy for the implementation of SEEA

 Promoting adoption of SEEA

•Regional Public Goods Project (IDB): state of the art, strategy, tool kit, capacity building plan



•Collaboration with other agencies (UNSD, WB, IDB, UNEP)
