COMESA Treaty Provisions

ARTICLE 122 Scope and Principles of Co-operation

- The Member States agree to take for their mutual benefit, concerted measures to foster <u>cooperation</u> in <u>the joint and efficient management and sustainable utilization of natural resources</u> <u>within the Common Market.</u>
- The Member States recognize that <u>economic activity is often accompanied by environmental</u> <u>degradation, excessive depletion of resources and serious damage to natural heritage and that a clean</u> <u>as well as an attractive environment is a prerequisite for long-term economic growth</u>.
- The Member States undertake, through a regional conservation strategy, to <u>co-operate and</u> <u>coordinate strategies</u> for the protection and preservation of the <u>environment</u> against all forms of <u>pollution</u> including <u>atmospheric and industrial pollution</u>, <u>pollution of the water resources</u>, <u>and pollution</u> <u>from urban development</u>.
- The Member States undertake to <u>co-operate and adopt common policies</u> for the control of <u>hazardous waste</u>, nuclear materials, radioactive materials and any other materials used in the <u>development or exploitation of nuclear energy</u>.

COMESA Treaty Provisions

Articles 123 Co-operation in Management of Natural Resources

- The Member States agree to take concerted measures to foster <u>co-operation in the joint and efficient management and sustainable utilization</u> <u>of natural resources within the Common Market</u> for the mutual benefit of the Member States.
- The Member States agree to take necessary measures to <u>conserve and</u> <u>manage forests</u>,
- The Member States shall take measures to engage in Api-Agro-Forestry Systems.
- The Member States agree to <u>co-operate in the management</u> of their <u>fresh</u> <u>water and marine resources</u>

COMESA Treaty Provisions

Article 124 Co-operation in the Management of the Environment

- The Member States undertake to co-operate in the management of the environment and agree to:
 - Develop a <u>common environmental management policy that would</u> preserve the ecosystems of the Member States, prevent, arrest and reverse the effects of environmental and industrial pollution, declining bio-diversity, loss of genetic diversity and land degradation;
 - Develop <u>special environmental management strategies to manage</u> <u>forests, terrestrial and marine resources, water resources, atmospheric</u> <u>emissions, water and hazardous toxic substances;</u>
 - <u>Take measures to control trans-boundary, air and water pollution</u> <u>arising from mining, fishing and agricultural activities.</u>

Linking policy to statistics

 Firstly Article 139 of the treaty highlights the need for comprehensive information systems which include the need for statistical series and other policy relevant information. Article 140 provides for cooperation in statistical development among member states in the harmonization and provision of statistics for regional policy making endeavors.

COMESA Statistics Strategy

- Provides <u>statistical articulation</u> of Treaty Provisions
- Objectives
 - To ensure that statistics in the region are produced using harmonized frameworks and/or international standards in order to ensure comparability.
 - To enhance the quality, availability and comprehensiveness of statistics in the region.
 - To ensure a wide dissemination of statistical outputs for use by policy makers and COMESA member States in their review and monitoring of the Common Market.
 - To implement new, efficient and innovative methods for the production and sharing of statistics in the COMESA region.
