Forest Management (Forest Act 12 of 2001)

- To provide for the establishment of a Forestry Council and the appointment of certain officials;
- to consolidate the laws relating to the management and use of forests and forest produce;
- to provide for the protection of the environment and the control and management of forest fires;
- to repeal the Preservation of Bees and Honey Proclamation, 1923 (Proclamation No. 1of 1923), Preservation of Trees and Forests Ordinance, 1952 (Ordinance No. 37 of 1952) and the Forest Act, 1968 (Act No. 72 of 1968);
- and to deal with incidental matters.

Forest status in Namibia, 2019

Harvesting permit issuance (average) per quarter (timber excluded):

- Harvesting (1016 tons)
- Transport commercial (1949 tons)
- Transport own (2131 tons)
- Import (47 tons)
- Export (1458 tons)
- Marketing (986 tons)
- In transit (1392 tons)

Number of fines issued (22)

Forest protection issues

Community Forest:

- is an area within the communal lands of Namibia that is managed in a sustainable way by local communities in order to protect forest and tree resources and to improve livelihoods.
- is aimed at implementing reforestation and afforestation to increase forest cover at national level;
- It deals with orchard development in the country with the purpose of increasing fruit production, poverty reduction and to create an opportunity for industrial development through agro-processing;
- It strive to significantly contribute to sustainable environmental management, by combating land degradation and reduction on greenhouse gas (CO²) emission etc.
- Forested area(community forests area = 3019592.57Ha
- By 2019, 43 community forests are Gazetted

Forest protection issues ...

- **De-bushing**: resulted in mass land clearance which could result in land degradation;
- **Bush-thinning**: replaced the mis-understood de-bushing

Forests and Forest Products Use

- Cooking (50% hh use wood/firewood)
- Housing (19% hh's structure made from poles/sticks/grass/reeds)
- Lighting (about 2.4% hh use wood)
- Browsing (livestock)
- Charcoal ??????
- Timber for furniture ??????
- Crafts/Wood Carvings ??????
- Livestock feed ??????
- Storage facilities ??????

International Sources vs National Data

- Forest and Woodland information could not be verified due to timeline and lack of information
- Land and agriculture:
 - Livestock Density figures differs with the national data <u>Namibia International Data</u> <u>24Sept2019.xlsx</u>

Conclusion

- Limited information about forestry is available
- Forestry data gap is huge
- UN agencies are having information available

Recommendations

- There is a need for thematic (forestry study(ies));
- NSDI need to be fully utilized to gather information;
- Sectoral statistics units, should be informed about all data collection taking place within their sector by international bodies;
- There is a need for UN agencies to work with relevant institution during compiling their estimates/data collections – if done (for capacity

building).
