


Production by area

- All countries produce:
 - Labour force, unemployment
 - Education
 - Disability
- Areas never measured in several countries
 - Entrepreneurship: 7
 - ICT: 6
 - Informal employment: 5
 - Unpaid work: 3 (10 measuring on irregular basis)


Areas of production of gender statistics






Extent of influence of the dialogue between users and producers by area
