Fifth Global Forum on Gender Statistics

Aguascalientes, Mexico, 3 to 5 November 2014

Concept Note and Agenda

Background

In collaboration with INEGI-Mexico, the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) is organizing the 5th Global Forum on Gender Statistics¹ under the *Global Gender Statistics Programme* and the guidance of the Interagency and Expert Group on Gender Statistics (IAEG-GS). The IAEG-GS, established in 2006, is composed of experts from both national and international statistical offices in charge of coordinating the *Global Programme*, mandated by the United Nations Statistical Commission, and aiming at:

- improving coherence among existing initiatives on gender statistics through international coordination
- developing and promoting methodological guidelines in existing domains as well as in emerging areas of concern related to gender equality and women's empowerment
- strengthening national statistical and technical capacity for the production, dissemination and use of gender relevant data
- facilitating access to gender relevant data and metadata.

Forums have proven to be an important opportunity to share, review and discuss initiatives and tools related to the collection, production, dissemination and use of gender statistics.

Topics to be covered

Following the recommendations from the 2012 Global Forum and other relevant meetings, the 2014 Global Forum on Gender Statistics will serve as a platform to review methods and data (including innovative approaches/initiatives) to measure and monitor gender equality and women's empowerment in the following thematic "pillars": women and the economy; violence against women; time use; political participation; the environment; and women in armed conflicts (please refer to attached provisional agenda for additional details).

The Forum will also address the issue of "data revolution", what it means in practice and how it can be used to fill in gender data gaps.

These topics were selected based on their relevance across a broad number of countries and on the fact that they are considered of "global" interest. However, the Global forum will be organized back to back with the XV International Meeting on Gender Statistics that will focus on additional topics relevant to the Latin American and the Caribbean region.

Each of the thematic pillars/sessions listed above will be organized with presentations on:

- (1) experiences and best practices (mostly from National Statistical Offices) sharing methods, techniques and challenges in producing gender statistics-*what is done and how*-;
- (2) presentations from data users (policy makers) -how it is used-;
- (3) presentations from academia/international organizations about research, experiences based on innovative approaches/initiatives and related recommendations – how it can be improved.

Some additional aspects (some are cross-cutting) that should be considered/covered in relevant sessions by presenters are the following:

- Ways to improve use of data for monitoring the effectiveness/impact of gender equality and women's empowerment policies and programmes (including allocation of budget);
- Designing campaigns using gender statistics and indicators, and strengthening the usersproducers dialogue;
- Data issues: data availability and international comparability
- Data analysis: better use of existing data; innovative ways of using economic data for gender analysis.
- Review of progress on commitments of the Beijing Platform for Action twenty years from its adoption; progress to meet the recommendations of the CEDAW.

Host country

The National Institute of Statistics and Geography of Mexico (INEGI, Instituto Nacional de Estadística y Geografía) will host the 5th Global Forum on Gender Statistics in Aguascalientes, Mexico.

- The Inter-agency and Expert Group on Gender Statistics (IAEG-GS) will meet on 2 November 2014.
- The XV International Meeting on Gender Statistics, organized by INEGI, INMUJERES, UNECLAC and UNWomen, will take place from 5 (afternoon) to 7 November 2014.
