## National minority languages and regional languages in Germany

## Summary\*\*

The official language in all parts of Germany is standard German. The languages of four national minorities that reside in Germany — the Danes, the Frisians, the Sorbs and the German Sinti and Roma — are officially recognized as minority languages.

Low German has the status of a regional language, which ensures the protection of that language in accordance with the European Charter for Regional or Minority Languages.
