Report of the Working Group on Romanization Systems: current status of United Nations romanization systems for geographical names

Summary**

The Working Group on Romanization Systems was established under the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names. The full report of the Working Group provides an outline of the main developments in respect of the status of various romanization and writing systems, including for Arabic, Georgian, Kazakh, Kurdish, Lao, Montenegrin, Sinhala and Tamazight.

A new system for the romanization of Arabic was adopted in 2017, at the Eleventh United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names (E/CONF.105/165, resolution XI/3) and, accordingly, the Working Group's report on Arabic has been updated to reflect the agreement (see www.eki.ee/wgrs/rom1 ar.pdf).

Since the Eleventh Conference, the Working Group has met once, at the Institut géographique national in Paris on 20 March 2018. Full details on romanization systems are available on the website of the Working Group (www.eki.ee/wgrs).
