ANALYSES OF ALL GEOGRAPHICAL NAMES STANDARDISED SINCE 2000

Introduction

A Working Forum on Geographical Names was established in 1996 to advise the Minister of Arts, Culture, Science and Technology on the reconstitution of the then National Place Names Committee (NPNC) with regard to the recommendations on the White Paper on Arts, Culture and Heritage, international standards and cultural concerns. It also had to attend to legislation. In accordance with the recommendations of the Working Forum on Geographical Names, the South African Geographical Names Council (SAGNC) was established by Act No. 118 of 1998 the South African Geographical Names Council Act. The SAGNC was inaugurated on 08 December 1999. It consists of 25 members and held its first business meeting in March 2000.

Hence there are 794 geographical names approved since then. The tables below give an analysis of names approved per province, language and feature type. Major feature types (e.g. town, post office, rivers and mountains) will also be included on this analysis.



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
The table above gives an overview of how many geographical names were approved since 2000 and the language in which the names were approved.

TOTAL NAMES APPROVED IN EACH PROVINCE



The chart indicates the number of names approved per province. Limpopo with 316 approved names, Eastern Cape with 134, North West with 132, Mpumalanga with 104, respectively. These are the provinces with the highest names approved, which are above 100 since the year 2000.

TOTAL NAMES APPROVED PER LANGUAGE



There are 180 Geographical names approved that are in Sesotho sa Leboa, 128 in isiXhosa, 123 in Setswana, most names being in North West and 82 in Tshivenda, respectively.

NAMES APPROVED SINCE 2000 PER FEATURE TYPE

There are different feature type names that have changed since 2000. This includes names for the Post Offices, Rivers, Dams etc. There are 383 post office names that have changed, towns being 131.

1. TOWNS

There are 131 town names approved since 2000 in six provinces. There are 71 town names that have changed since 2000 in Limpopo and most of the major town names are also in Limpopo.




