TRANSFER OF NAMES FROM ONE TRITING SYSTEM INTO ANOTHER

Report of the Jorking Group on a Single Romanization System, 7 December 1971 to 15 April 1972 (part II)

- 1. Since the composition of part I of this report thirteen circulars have been distributed amongst the membership of the Working Group. These circulars include:
- (a) Draft systems for the romanization of the Devanagari alphabet and of Khmen writing.
 - (b) A comparative study of the romanization of the Russian alphabet.
- (c) Comparative tables of the romanization of the Thai, Laotian, Japanese, and Devanagari writing systems.
- (d) Comments on the romanization of the Arabic, Pashtu, and Burmese alphabets.
- 2. The chairman of the group corresponded with the expert of the Arabic division concerning a uniform romanization of the Arabic alphabet.
- 3. It is planned that the orking Group will hold its fifth meeting in London on 9 May 1972, i.e. the day immediately before the second United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names.
