- It is hoped that this presentation will assist first-time delegates and observers to have a productive and rewarding week at the United Nations headquarters.







- UN Group of Experts on Geographical Names
 - one of expert groups of ECOSOC
 - follows up on implementation of resolutions
 - provides continuity between conferences
 - convenes between conferences (2) ... 29 sessions
 - supported by a Secretariat at UNHQ (NY)
 - creates working groups
 to follow up on resolutions
 - has 24 geographical/linguistic divisions for grass roots work







What UNGEGN is NOT

- Decision maker on feature names
- Point of arbitration on disputes over names
- Place to air political issues, even if they are related in some way to place names
- Decision maker on what processes, legislation or policy is correct for any country







UN Conference/UNGEGN aims


- See national names authorities created
 - backed by legislation
 - respect local usage of names
 - collect, store and disseminate authorized names
 - for government and public use
- Develop single scientifically-based systems of romanization
- Today encourage multi-national datasets


Participants are encouraged to:




Summaries

A brief summary for each Agenda Item.

Reports and Background Documents

Reports are prepared by working groups, divisions, Member States or secretariat as appropriate. They are available on the Session /Meeting webpages. Document as listed, has a document number/symbol, a title and may have a summary. All Summaries for are available in all six official UN languages. Reports documents are only available in its original language of submission, usually English.



Participants are encouraged to read all documents and identify issues to be discussed.





DURING the 11TH Conference

Participants are encouraged to:

- Contact your Permanent Mission in New York
- Become acquainted with the UNCSGN work items
- Actively contribute to the Technical Committees thru statements and interventions
- Share your experiences, ideas and solutions
- Be short and concise in your interventions
- Identify working groups in which to participate

Why it is important to actively participate:

- An ideal forum for networking
- Recharge technically and reconnect with experts
- Let your country's achievements and requirements be known





DURING the 11TH Conference

To indicate an interest to speak:

- Press the button under the microphone in front of you.
- A green light under the microphone means that you are in the queue to speak.
- Once given the floor by the Chair/President, you should press the button once again to indicate to the sound engineer your readiness to speak and the green light will turn red which means that the microphone is activated.
