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Regional geographical names in the German Democratic Republic

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1. Introduction

In the past few years, the German Democratic Republic continued its efforts to standardize geographical names in order to comply with resolutions adopted by the conferences of the United Nations on the standardization of geographical names (Resolution 4 of the 1st Conference, Resolution 25 of the 2nd Conference and Resolution 16 of the 3rd Conference). The result of the work undertaken in an effort to standardize geographical names on the Baltic Sea coast of the German Democratic Republic was submitted to the 8th Session of the Expert Group of the United Nations (1979) (working paper No. 18). The recently completed list of regional geographical names of the GDR is a further move towards the full-scale implementation of the above-mentioned resolutions in the GDR. In this context, the regional geographical names are the most important names of the regions, mountains, hill-ranges and lowlands on the territory of the German Democratic Republic. The list of the regional geographical names and the map on the scale 1: 750,000 showing the situation and the dimensions of the objects are of great importance to the solution of several problems, such as

- the uniform spelling of these names in all cartographical products of the GDR;
- the proper allocation of the names to the objects and their dimensions;
- the proper selection and generalization of these names on topographical maps, graticule maps, general geographical survey maps or other special-purpose maps, such as maps for tourism;
- the coordination of spelling of the names of objects situated on the territory of two or more countries.

The list and the map were prepared on the basis of an extensive analysis of cartographical, geographical and local sources.

All in all, these materials have marked a substantial progress in the daily efforts for a standardization of geographical names in the GDR. Moreover, an international exchange of such materials under the United Nations programme for a standardization of geographical names constitutes a contribution to the implementation of the Resolutions of the Conferences dealing with the names of objects situated on the territory of two or more countries (Resolution 8 of the 1st Conference, Resolution 24 of the 2nd Conference, Resolution 20 of the 3rd Conference).
