When we look at North America in the 17th century the areas colonized by the maritime powers of Europe were called, respectively, ***Nouvelle France*** (Nova Francia), ***New England*** (Nova Anglia), ***Nieuw Nederland*** (Nova Belgium), and ***New Scotland*** (Nova Scotia). Below fragments of a map by **Janssonius** (1636) showing the claimed lands by the maritime powers. Virginia was named by English explorers after their virgin Queen, Elisabeth I..
