

SDI Programs Worldwide

5 key areas of focus to date:

- Framework data definition and development
- Geospatial data discovery and download
- Web mapping (sometimes from several different servers & integrated on your browser)
- Cultivation of "communities of practice"
- Definition and development of standards and standards-based products to enable the above

A Changing Marketplace

- Corporate downsizing and reorientation of government programs
- Commoditization and "mass customization" of products and services
- Challenges to traditional geomatics approaches in developing countries
- Evolving expectations of users re: capability, performance, transparency, simplicity and reliability

Mapping Emphasis and Library/Bookstore Metaphor limited the vision


Emphasis on widespread, mass-market use of government mapping files has not taken hold.


