

Establishment


UN-GGIM-AP

- Established :1
 November 2012
- Replacing PCGIAP
- Members: NGIAs of 56 countries and regions in Asia and the Pacific
- Report to ECOSOC through UNRCC-AP
 and UN-GGIM

Working Groups

WG1: Geodetic Reference Framework for Sustainable Development


