Geographical names and linguistic minorities

Summary**

It is indicated in the report that a white paper on the Sami language has been published.¹ Discussed in that white paper, among other things, are the safeguarding and use of geographical names in Sami. Reference is made to previous cases of place names in Sami having been hidden, rewritten in Norwegian and/or removed from maps. Sami place names now enjoy strong legal protection under national legislation, specifically the Sami Act and the Place Names Act. There are also international obligations in this regard.

Emphasis is laid on the duty of the public authorities to actively promote the use of Sami place names in Sami-language areas.
