Summary

Welsh names have been depicted on Ordnance Survey (OS) maps of Wales for some time, but in July 2001 the Ordnance Survey published a Welsh Language Scheme to comply with the Welsh Language Act of 1993. Taking advice from the Welsh Language Board, the Ordnance Survey is revising many of its large- and small-scale products covering Wales, including the popular 1:50,000 Landranger map series. Effort is being concentrated on the collection and consistent depiction of Welsh place names and, where there is evidence of use, both Welsh and English names will be depicted.
