## Summary of meeting:

The co-chairs, Philippines and Mexico, opened the meeting.

The existing **Terms of Reference** (**ToR**) of the Advisory Group on Emerging Issues were discussed. It was suggested to:

- a) request the IAEG-GS to extend the duration of the Advisory Group on Emerging Issues to February 2016
- b) review the list of issues included in the ToR and make the distinction between issues and indicators
- prioritize the future work of the group c)

The work of the group and the proposal on the Reconciliation of indicators for Violence against women (VaW) was presented by UNSD. The main points of discussion were:

- a) Clarification on why indicator 48 combines physical and sexual violence whereas indicator 49 separates the two dimensions.
  - For consistency, it was decided to also separate indicator 48 into physical violence and sexual violence.
- b) Question on the use of "ever-partnered"
  - The reference population should be women who were in a relationship (partnership) in the last 12 months
  - Recommended to include metadata explaining what are the denominator and numerator.
- c) ILO is working on guidelines for violence in the workplace
- d) ESCAP suggested including information on the pro/con of using the UNECE Module as a stand alone survey versus as an add-on to an existing survey.
- e) India inquired about the suggested frequency of dedicated surveys on violence against women.

UNSD, UN Women and FAO updated the group on the EDGE project.
