Introduction



Time Use Survey (TUS) is a household survey which collects data about the time spent by women and men on various activities, including paid and unpaid work, domestic work, care, volunteer activities, learning, cultural and sports activities, socialization, leisure, self-care, etc.



Survey Objectives



- > The Georgia Time Use Survey (GTUS) was conducted from September 2020 to September 2021 (for the first time)
 - ✓ With the financial and technical support of UN Women
- Survey Goals
 - ✓ To provide internationally comparable time-use data
 - ✓ To enlarge and improve gender statistics
 - ✓ To obtain essential data for measuring SDG 5.4.1 (Proportion of time spent on unpaid domestic and care work, by sex, age and location)
 - ✓ To inform design of policies aimed at strengthening gender equality in Georgia.
- Conducting TUS is one of the priorities of
 - ✓ National Strategy for the Development of Statistics in Georgia (2020-2023)
 - ✓ Strategy for Gender Statistics (2021-2023)



The Methodology of the Survey



- > Time Use Survey was based on the latest international methodological guidelines
 - ✓ HETUS Methodology, questionnaires and time use diary developed by Eurostat and TUS Working Group
 - ✓ ICATUS Classification developed by the UN "International Classification of Activities for Time Use Statistics"
- Survey instruments
 - ✓ Household Questionnaire
 - ✓ Respondent Informed household adult member
 - ✓ Individual Questionnaire
 - ✓ Respondent Every household member 15 years and older
 - ✓ Time Use Diary
 - ✓ Respondent Every household member 15 years and older
- Data collection method
 - ✓ Face to face Computer Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) for Household and individual questionnaires (The World Bank's software "Survey Solutions" was used for preparing electronic questionnaires for tablets)
 - ✓ Self administered paper based interview for diaries to collect data on time use

MANUALS AND eurostat



- The survey covered the population 15 years of age or over living in private households across the country excluding the population living in the occupied territories of Georgia (namely the Autonomous Republic of Abkhazia and the Tskhinvali region/South Ossetia)
- Sample frame Population Census 2014 (with listing)
- ➤ Initial sample size 3 120 households
- 3 Domains (for each domain 1 040 households)
 - 1. Tbilisi
 - 2. Other urban areas
 - 3. Rural areas





For each domain

Three-stage Stratified Cluster Random Sampling

Primary Sample Units (PSUs) - Census area units (104)

10 Households (addresses/dwellings) within all selected PSUs (1 040)

All 15+ HH members within the all selected household


Each respondent filled two time use diaries

- 1. One for weekdays
- 2. One for weekend



Sample allocation across time

- > The sample PSUs were allocated across the 52 weeks (for the period of September 7, 2020 September 5, 2021)
- > For each week, a total of 6 sampled PSUs were selected
 - ➤ Tbilisi 2 PSU
 - > Other urban areas 2 PSU





Replacement

> Replacement was not used for the households who refused

Postponement of diary day

- ➤ If respondent was not able to fill the diary for the predefined diary day postponement could be done by:
 - > 7 days
 - > 14 days
 - ➤ 21 days

Interview day - before the diary day for which the diary was filled





Household Questionnaire

- Respondent Informed household member aged 15 years or older
- Data collection method CAPI



Individual Questionnaire

- Respondent All household members aged 15 years and older
- Data collection method CAPI



Diary


- Respondent All household members aged 15 years and older
 - Two diaries per respondent
 - Weekday
 - Weekend
- Data collection method Self administered paper based interview (field by respondent)

Time Use Diary



Activities were recorded for each 10-minute slot for 24 hours period (from 04:00 AM to 04:00 AM)

Main variables:

- Main activity
- Parallel activity

Context variables:

- For whom For whom the activity was performed (myself, for own household, for other HHs/persons, for work, for community, organization, etc.)
- > IT Whether the use of information technology was involved in carrying out the activity (computer, smartphone, internet etc.)
- > Location/Transport The physical location where the activity was carried out or, if travelling, how the respondent was travelling
- > With whom Who they were with at the time of carrying out the activity (alone, with other HH member, other persons etc.)

Methodology Adaptation




Adaptation/Modification	Result
ICATUS activity classification is used instead of HETUS	More detailed data is collected on time use - ICATUS - 165 codes; HETUS - 116 codes
Employment module is modified	Employment data was collected in line with ILO's latest standards (introduced at Geostat since 2020)
Housing module was added	Data on number of rooms, usage of durable goods, access on internet etc. were collected
Education module was modified	Module was adapted in line with national educational system in the country
Additional variable was added in diary – for whom activity was done	Additional information to better distinguish paid/unpaid work
Question on functional difficulties was added	Persons with functional difficulties are identified

Challenges



- > Challenge survey fieldwork coincided with the period of the COVID-19 pandemic non-response rate was increased
- Measures taken to achieve sufficient response rate:
 - 1. Increasing of the sample size
 - From November, 2020
 - > In Tbilisi from 10 to 14 HH
 - From June, 2021
 - > In Tbilisi from 14 to 20 HH
 - In other urban areas from 14 to 20 HH
 - 2. Suggesting to respondents filling household and individual questionnaires by telephone interview
- Achieved sample size 3 680 households
 - Response rate 63.3 %
 - > Tbilisi 49.2%
 - Other urban areas 66.5%
 - Rural areas 80.8%





The level of participation of the population in different activities during 24 hours, %






SDG 5.4.1. proportion of time spent on unpaid domestic and care work, percent




By type of settlement
