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



# In LAC women spend 3 times more time than men on unpaid work


(domestic and care work)



## **Key contributions**

Minimum set of time-use activities for LA&C: Questionnaire proposal as instrument towards international comparability with a gender perspective (Chapter V).

- Based on <u>31 activities</u> prioritized to inform the care economy and women's autonomy.
- Specific cases of using the information on time-use for **policy design about care** (Uruguay, Paraguay, Costa Rica, Mexico, Chile, Bogotá-Colombia-, Cuba and Argentina); employment and poverty (Chapter VI).
- Guidelines for conducting time use surveys in each phase of the statistical process (Chapters IV and II):
  - Advantages and disadvantages of different methodological design options: independent survey or module; survey types (activity diary or list of activities); data collection methodologies; reference time period (previous week, previous day); target population; type of informant (...).
  - **Relations between international classifications** on time use measurements and work: CAUTAL (from LA&C), ICATUS, National Accounts Systems (Chapter III).

#### Comunidad de Práctica para la Medición de la Sociedad del Cuidado

Esta comunidad se establece en el marco del trabajo conjunto entre la Comisión Económica para América Latina y el Caribe (CEPAL), la Entidad de las Naciones Unidas para el Empoderamiento de la Mujer y la Igualdad de Género (ONU-Mujeres) y el Instituto Nacional de las Mujeres (INMUJERES) de México, en el contexto de la Red de Transmisión de Conocimiento de la Conferencia Estadística de las Américas (RTC-CEA) y la Alianza Global por los Cuidados. Su objetivo principal es proveer un espacio de intercambio de experiencias, conocimientos y publicaciones relacionadas con la medición del cuidado, con el fin de contribuir al fortalecimiento de la producción de datos estadísticos para la construcción de sociedades del cuidado en América Latina y el Caribe.

#### ¿Qué es la sociedad del cuidado?

La sociedad del cuidado es un horizonte que supone una construcción colectiva y multidimensional para desatar los nudos estructurales de la desigualdad de género y ubicar el cuidado de las personas y del planeta en el centro del desarrollo sostenible. Es una propuesta de organización social que ubica la sostenibilidad de la vida como objetivo prioritario. Para ello es preciso reconocer el valor del cuidado tanto de las personas como del planeta y de redistribuir su provisión sobre la base de la corresponsabilidad social y de género.

Los gobiernos de la región, a través Compromiso de Buenos Aires adoptado en la XV Conferencia Regional sobre la Mujer de América Latina y el Caribe, proponen la transición hacia una sociedad del cuidado que priorice la sostenibilidad de la vida y del planeta, que garantice los derechos de las personas que necesitan cuidados, así como los derechos de las personas que los proveen, que considere el autocuidado y el intercuidado, que contrarreste la precarización de los empleos relacionados con el sector de los cuidados y que visibilice los efectos multiplicadores de la economía del cuidado en términos del bienestar y como un sector dinamizador para una recuperación transformadora con igualdad y sostenibilidad.
