Statistical standard-setting activities

- 20th International Conference of Labour Statisticians (ICLS) –October 2018
 - Adopted updated **resolution concerning statistics on work relationships**
 - Replaces previous International Classification of Status in Employment (ICSE-93)
 - New scope expanded to cover all productive activities (paid and unpaid forms of work)
 - Family of classifications:
 - **ICSE-18A:** Status in Employment according to type of authority
 - **ICSE-18R:** Status in Employment according to type of economic risk
 - **ICSaW-18:** Status at Work (covering all forms of work, paid and unpaid)
 - Introduces new major category for Dependent Contractors plus new detailed categories

Gender relevance of ICSE-18

- Enable more detailed analysis of worker relationship
 - Focus on exposure to risk, degree of dependency, work stability
- Recommends additional variables to enable identification of policy relevant groups
 - domestic workers, home-based workers, seasonal workers, workers in triangular relationships, etc
- Recognizes biases in reporting status in employment (based on self-perception) in data collection
 - Recommends multi-step approach to classify workers by nature of work relationship

Survey testing & guidance development

- Women's Work & Employment Partnership (ILO, WB, Data2x)
 - Focus on measurement of employment & own-use production
 - Issue guidance on gender issues in LFS / LSMS data collection
- Volunteer work measurement (ILO-UN Volunteers, 2018-2020)
 - Issue guidance on measurement of volunteer work (direct & organization-based volunteering) through LFS module
 - Compile existing data & analysis of gender & age patterns in volunteer work participation
- Own-use provision of services measurement (ILO, Data2x, starting 2020-)
 - Issue guidance on modular Time-use approaches that can be integrated to LFS to capture unpaid provision of household services






Data collection & Dissemination

- New “Gender & labour market database” (forthcoming Jan 2020)
 - In partnership with UN Women
- Based on ILO LFS microdata holdings
 - for 151 countries, for some countries multiple years
- Cross-tabulations of key labour market outcomes by sex, age, and
 - Marital status
 - Household composition (living arrangements)
 - Presence of children in different age groups (below 6, below 18)
 - Place of residence (urban / rural)
- Reports with gender analysis of key trends
