UNICEF's work in the area of gender statistics

- <u>Data collection:</u> support to countries in the collection of genderrelevant data through MICS (data by sex, plus specific modules such as maternal mortality, FGM/C)
- <u>Data compilation:</u> <u>UNICEF</u> global databases include data by sex from different sources including administrative records, vital registration, population census and household surveys
- <u>Methodological work:</u> production of global estimates on relevant issues and development of gender sensitive indicators
- <u>Data analysis and dissemination</u>: UNICEF data are used in several publications and, in the case of MICS data, are available in the form of national reports, statistical profiles, standard sets of tabulations and micro level datasets (www.childinfo.org)



Data collection: Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys (MICS)

UNICEF's support for data collection: MICS

- Household surveys designed to collect data on children and women and to provide evidence base for improved policy formulation and programme planning
- Key data source for monitoring the MDGs, the World Fit for Children goals, and other major international commitments
- More than 100 indicators (nutrition, child health, mortality, child protection, education, HIV, etc.) with data available by background characteristics (sex, ethnicity, wealth, education, etc.)
- Specific modules on traditional harmful practices, marriage, attitudes towards domestic violence, access to antenatal and postnatal care
- More than 200 MICS surveys conducted since 1995 more than 100 countries
- Current activities: MICS 4 conducted in 2011-2012 in more than 50 countries




