In an effort to better produce gender statistics which could support evidence-based decision-making, the Ghana Statistical Service (GSS) is exploring a “data shift” from the traditional use of census and surveys to harnessing new data sources.

To Address Data Quality

Due to sensitive nature of the subject - Gender-Based Violence is globally under-reported both in administrative data and in survey

'Let's talk' is an app that provides help to survivors and collects anonymous information on gender-based violence. By knowing how often this is experienced, your District Assembly can plan better services for your community.

Things to Know



Let's talk is completely anonymous, it doesn't ask for your name or contact details



No information will be shared with the police



You can report by voice or text and there will be no record or trace on your phone of reporting



You can get helplines for counselling and other services



District Assembly will be able to see how often this is happening



You can record on behalf of someone else
