## CONTEXT

- United Nations Statistical Commission 50<sup>th</sup> Session: Report on crime and criminal justice statistics (E/CN.3/2019/19).
- Pledge for the development of a statistical framework on gender-sensitive crime statistics, with a focus on the gender-related killing of women and girls (femicide/ feminicide), based on the ICCS
- UN Women, UNODC and other Int. agencies have discussed the key elements to build a common UN approach on gender-related killings of women and girls (femicide/ feminicide) for statistical purposes



### PROBLEM

- The concept of "femicide/feminicide" can have very different connotations, in some countries it is even considered as a specific criminal offence.
- The current discussion at the international level is about a comprehensive definition of the concept of gender-related killing of women and girls (femicide/feminicide) for <u>statistical purposes</u> only.
- Objective is to identify specific types of killings that have a policy-relevance from a gender perspective and have objective features such that they can be measured



## STARTING POINT

- The current international standard for crime statistics is the International Classification of Crimes for Statistical Purposes (ICCS).
- Countries are still in the process of fully adopting the ICCS and produce disaggregated data in line with its various variables.
- The ICCS offers various opportunities to identify gender motivation of crime and the genderrelated context, though more operational guidance is needed.

The ICCS defines Intentional Homicide as the "Unlawful death inflicted upon a person with the intent to cause death or serious injury". Femicide/ Feminicide falls into this category.

### Towards a common approach


- 33 gender-related criteria (and related disaggregating variables and categories) have been identified to have an open discussion with data producers, practitioners and substantive experts
- Criteria grouped by themes:





# HOMICIDE DISAGGREGATION

 An initial approximation to the gender-related killing of women and girls (femicide/ feminicide) is the measurement of killings by intimate partner/family member. But this is only a subset of the whole phenomenon, further disaggregation is needed.



## NEXT STEPS

- **Consultation launch**: Finalise questionnaire/platform and descriptive document. Ongoing
- Feedback: Receive responses from national institutions/experts Early 2021
- Assessment: Analysis of feedback Q1 2021
- **Development**: prepare draft statistical framework Q1-Q2 2021
- Refinement: final consultation on the proposed framework
  Q2 2021
- Submission: Framework is sent to UNSC for its endorsement in its 53<sup>rd</sup> session
  Q3 2021
