
Making Every Woman and Girl Count

- 1. Enabling policy environment: Putting in place an enabling environment for a gender-responsive localization and effective monitoring of national and international policy commitments;
- 2. Data production: Filling gender data gaps by ensuring that quality and comparable gender statistics are produced regularly; and
- 3. Data use: Ensuring that gender statistics are accessible and used to inform policy and advocacy.
- 4. LME: Learning through monitoring and evaluation about the most cost-effective ways to support capacity building in gender statistics

Implementation in 2017: Program development

- Global → Revision for better monitoring; recruitment of staff; PARIS21 NSDS project; global monitoring of SDGs
- Regional → ECA and A&P programme development (assessment in ECA, prodoc development, recruitment); Africa gender statistics assessment & programme development
- Countries → Development of country work plans
- Establishment of a Centre of Excellence (with INEGI)
- Continued development of joint UNW/WHO Global VAW data programme
- Development of advocacy and communication strategy





Implementation in 2017: data production

- SDG data collection (Tier I and Tier II): data compilation for Time use and VAW;
- Gender and disability data for HLPF
- Collaboration with the World Bank on gender and poverty through the lifecycle
- Methodological work on Tier III indicators (5.5.1b and 5.c.1 wrapped up and submitted to IAEG-SDGs for reclassification into Tier II; testing for 5.1.1 to be completed in Q1 2018)

Under way:

Development of guide for SDGs localization (mainly for UN Women COs and ROs)



WOMEN Implementation in 2017: data availability & use

- SDG Monitoring work on first edition of Gender and SDGs monitoring report (Q1 2018); products for HLPF (Spotlight on SDGs)
- User-producer events (1st World Data Forum; HLPF; CSW etc.)
- Development of SDGs data portal (scoping study; stepwise plans for 2017 and 2018)
- Joint workshop AfDB, UNECA and UNW (end November 2017)

Through our flagship programme, Making Every Women and Girl Count, UN Women aims to bring about a radical shift in how gender statistics are created, used and promoted at the global, regional and national levels.

Working together with governments, civil society, academia and other international agencies, the programme will support efforts to increase the availability of data on gender equality and women's rights in order to inform policy and decision-making.





Implementation plans in 2018

- Programme implementation

 - NSDS Gender module (with PARIS21)
 - EVAW programme;
 - CoE
- Launch of 1st edition of UNW's Gender and SDGs Monitoring Report
- Development and launch of SDGs data portal
- Various user-producer events, including CSW Expert data panel (possible focus on Big Data – but ideas are welcome)





A global Centre of Excellence (CoE) on gender statistics

Collaboration between Government of Mexico, INEGI and UN Women

- Initial investment of US\$1,300,000 from the Mexican Government
- Aims to foster research, innovation, cooperation and exchange of experiences for the effective adaptation, implementation and monitoring of gender in SDGs/national policy
- Hosted by INEGI, build on and raise the global profile of INEGI's leadership in gender statistics
- CoE to focus on the following activities:
 - provide technical assistance and training services to NSOs and user communities (particularly in Central America);
 - An innovation lab;
 - Promote South–South and triangular cooperation.
 - Collaborate with existing institutions such as the Statistical Institute of Asia Pacific (SIAP), UN Women's Training Centre and the UN Staff College
