

What is the African Charter on Statistics (ACS)?

A regional legal instrument which defines:

- the principles governing the activity of the institutions in charge of collecting, producing, disseminating and analysing public statistics, and
- the **ethical** and **professional** rules of **conduct** of African statisticians

Strengthen the effective implementation of the UN Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics

Adopted in Feb. 2009, entered into force in Feb. 2015.
