Workshop on the Implementation of a National Quality Assurance Framework for Official Statistics in Countries of the Latin American and Caribbean Region

Bogota, Colombia, 22-24 November 2023

Concept note and tentative agenda

(as of 14 November 2023)

In March 2019, the United Nations Statistical Commission adopted the United Nations National Quality Assurance Frameworks Manual for Official Statistics (Manual¹), including the recommendations contained therein (Decision 50/106²). The Statistical Commission welcomed the Manual as an important contribution in guiding countries in the implementation of a national quality assurance framework, including for new data sources, new data providers, and for data and statistics of the Sustainable Development Goal indicators.

The development of the Manual greatly benefitted from a country survey conducted in 2017 by the Expert Group on National Quality Assurance Frameworks.³ The survey showed that many countries had yet to implement a national quality assurance framework (NQAF). The Statistical Commission at its 52nd session in March 2021 tasked the Expert Group to conduct a follow-up survey to assess progress in the implementation of national quality assurance frameworks by national statistical systems. The results of this follow-up survey were made available to countries as background document to the 54th session of the Commission.⁴ The Commission took note of the results of the survey and the progress achieved, but also acknowledged the fact that many countries have yet to implement a national quality assurance framework

In addition to the Manual, the Expert Group released a self-assessment checklist to support NQAF implementation.⁵ Also, an e-leaning module⁶ and a revamped website with electronic versions of the Manual and the checklist⁷ have been made available. Furthermore, at its 54th session in March 2023, the Statistical Commission welcomed and endorsed a Roadmap for the implementation of a national quality assurance framework developed by the Expert Group.⁸ At this session, the Commission also expressed its support of the work programme of the Expert Group for the period of 2023-2024 with a special focus on quality assurance when new and administrative data sources are used. The recent survey specifically asked countries about their practices in this area.

The workshop will train participants from national statistical offices on quality assurance and its implementation throughout the national statistical system. It will also support the development of additional guidelines on quality assurance. Specifically, the workshop will provide an overview of the contents of the Manual, the United Nations National Quality Assurance Framework, the Code of Good Practice in Statistics for Latin America and the Caribbean, and ECLAC's Guide for the implementation of a quality assurance framework for statistical processes and outputs. It will review and discuss the implementation of quality assurance in participating countries. A special focus will be on quality assurance when administrative and other data sources (such as big data or citizen generated data) are used for producing official statistics. Other topics will include quality culture and data stewardship. The sharing of experiences will be a central element of this workshop and support the development of additional guidance on some of the above-mentioned topics.

The workshop is organized by the United Nations Statistics Division and the Economic Commission for Latin America (ECLAC) in cooperation with the National Administrative Department of Statistics of Colombia (DANE).
