### Coordination of the SNA revision and the BPM update

## **Drafting and testing phases**

- The testing phase will ideally start in 2021 at least on some topics and will take place in parallel to the
  drafting of both manuals, which will start in 2022. Therefore, close-to-final decisions should be
  pursued for adoption by BOPCOM and AEG/ISWGNA in 2020 for the most advanced topics and by
  the end of 2021 for the majority of the research issues
- To align with the SNA process, some of the BPM proposals/guidance notes will also be tested in
  parallel to the drafting phase. To that aim, volunteer countries will be sought for BPM related issues,
  mostly through BOPCOM. Joint guidance notes will be tested in countries in consultation with
  BOPCOM and AEG/ISWGNA and preferably through collaboration between NSOs and CBs
- Not everything needs to be tested either for the SNA or the BPM: the testing should mostly focus on significant issues requiring new institutional arrangements, data collections, statistical production structures and statistical infrastructure
- The drafting of the parts subject to testing will be backloaded, such that the outcome of the testing can be considered. If the testing revealed the impracticality of something being proposed, the decisions would be reconsidered and adapted accordingly.
- The guidance notes will still mention conceptually optimal recommendations that are nevertheless
  considered impractical. The guidance note may suggest testing and reassessing these
  recommendations in a few years' time, when new data sources or methods may allow their
  implementation.

#### How should the manuals look like at the end of the process?

- The manuals will be available in electronic form such that the different parts/sections can be searched
  and downloaded (this is consistent with the recommendations of the Friends of the Chair and is being
  discussed under the Joint Communications Task Team).
- The possibility of adopting the same structure and text for common text segments and concepts like
  residence, institutional units, valuation principles, accruals/time of recording, etc. will be considered,
  which will require some adjustments and additional work by the editors

#### **AEG/ISWGNA** and country consultations:

• The early BPM one-month consultation process was requested by worldwide compilers in the previous BPM update process. It's a way of getting early feedback from compilers (and users)

- not involved in the update process with a view to informing the proposals to be presented to BOPCOM and AEG/ISWGNA
- The current one-week consultation with the AEG/ISWGNA (and BPTT) is only meant to highlight major issues before the guidance notes go to public consultation. The final opinion of the AEG/ISWGNA will be sought at a later stage, in parallel to the Committee consultation.
- Along these lines, we suggest including the following paragraph in the communication with AEG members for the current consultation:

"The AEG is not being asked to provide a final opinion at this stage. Therefore, please focus your review on substantive issues (especially in case of strong disagreement with the recommendations of the respective TTs) before the notes go to the one-month public consultation envisaged in the BPM update process. You may also consider whether the questions for discussion to BOPCOM and the AEG included in the GNs go in the right direction. The AEG will be consulted again at the end of the process, in parallel to the consultation with BOPCOM."

- As an exception, the AEG deadline for this current round can be extended to two weeks. Given
  the need to have some of the GNs ready for the BOPCOM meeting (October 26-29), the BPM
  global consultation will be initiated as initially envisaged and AEG/ISWGNA's feedback will be
  incorporated at the next stage of the review process. Given that the GNs are deemed
  uncontroversial, no substantial issues are expected at this stage.
- Whether the global consultations envisaged by the SNA and BPM have one or two steps (the first
  focusing on the conceptual soundness and the second on the practical applicability (through
  experimentation and testing) of the guidance notes still needs to be clarified, and may vary by
  subject.

#### Other

- GZTT to become a joint group and report to both AEG/ISWGNA and BOPCOM. This should be formalized as soon as possible.
- IMF on behalf of BOPCOM and UNSD on behalf of AEG/ISWGNA will continue monitoring the alignment of the processes, timelines, terminologies for the revisions of SNA and BPM through a monthly schedule of consultations based on agreed annual programmes of work.
