General comment	In general the chapter looks more user-oriented than producer-oriented. It is not clear if the analysis refers to the households as institutional unit or to the activity performed by households.

B. Sub-sectoring households (paragraphs 24.6-24.21)

General comment	In our opinion paragraphs under point 1 "The production perspective" are not clear and precise enough and may be misleading. The sub-sector of Households proposed in paragraph 24.6 is quite demanding as it requires to distinguish: 1 institutional households; 2 households that do encompass an unincorporated enterprise: 2.1 housing services produced by owner-occupiers of dwelling; 2.2 households employing paid domestic staff; 2.3 households employing paid staff in their unincorporated enterprises; 2.4 own-account workers; 3 households that do not encompass an unincorporated enterprise. Compiling separate accounts for such sub-sectors would need to undertake a significant commitment which would probably prove to be disproportionate with respect to the improvement of information one could obtain: as an example, as to the productive behaviour, no significant differences characterise subsectors 2.1, 2.2 and 3. An alternative proposal could envisage an analysis of Households sector based on the distinction between the generation of mixed income, accruing to own-account workers or to employers of unincorporated enterprises (that are non quasi-corporations) with paid staff, and the generation of operating surplus resulting from the production activity
