General comments:

General comment	The chapter is not clear enough. After the reading, uncertainties on how to identify informal production units and informal jobs are not solved. In particular, it is not clear the distinction between the informal economy and the formal, underground and illegal economy.
	In the chapter, it is said that informal economy could be present in developed countries too. Nevertheless, it is difficult to recognize informal units of production in the above countries because underground and illegal activities are more recognizable. Some examples of informal activities and types of informal employment in the developed countries are welcome.
	It is no possible to recognize a unique operational definition of informal economy. If this is not the case, it seems difficult to assist States to collect, analyse and disseminate consistent statistics on the above issue.

25.23	The criterion of excluding modern occupation from the informal economy is not clear. In particular, it is not clear the criterion of distinguishing occupations with respect to the extent to which the activity is dependent on fixed capital. May you provide some further information?
